The Spirit at First January 2019

all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; we are now justified by Christ's grace as a gift.....

Romans 3:23-24

One of the foundational principles of the Protestant Reformation is the affirmation of Paul's writing in the letter to Rome that we all fall short of the glory of God, and are in need of Jesus' love to make us whole. For anyone except little children, we should all be well familiar with our own negative ways of living; our issues. I think we come to self-knowledge as we age due to more leisure time to reflect and the increasing necessity to survive with others. Bettering ourselves as we mature and grow towards God's image of us is known as sanctification.

Paul's wisdom, coming from Jesus' teaching also refers to organizations, which naturally includes the church. The church can never be complacent; the church as a body always needs to reflect on their strengths and weaknesses. The early church had to come to the realization that despite being followers of Christ and working to instill divine love into everyone they met, it could still sin. This may sound simplistic, but it took hundreds of years before the church came to fully realize this reality in its shared life. And even today, there are plenty of churches and religious traditions that believe they are following Christ's way correctly while everyone else is not. This naturally is hubris.

Every person, every church, every organization is called to reflect of their shared life and grow in the areas where they have fallen short and lift up the areas where they have succeeded. It seems to not only be a good discipline for growth but one grounded in faith and Christ's own teaching. AA embeds this behavioral corrective when adherents comply with "making a fearless moral inventory" and then make amends with all the people you have negatively affected.

The new year offers all of us an opportunity to enter this reflective process for it affords us a time to look back at the past year and put into action plans for the upcoming year. This last week, I received a letter from a family that had withdrawn from our community; in the letter I finally heard some of the reasoning of why they had left. Their critique and hurt cut me to the quick for they were a blessing to our church and I personally liked them very much. They withdrew from the lack of support their family received and the emphasis of money that they perceived as critical to membership. Our church ever needs to hear these hard truths and work on changing so that we can grow into the community Christ envisioned.

And we also need to proclaim the many positive elements of our church and reinforce those areas and tell others about them: vibrant worship, great music, fantastic children / youth ministry, a progressive yet Christocentric theology, significant outreach / social justice, and a community where folks are friendly and caring. The best way to spread that positive news is to share it by word of mouth: 70 % of new members come to the church because a friend invites them!

So I would invite all of you to take the turning of the year to reflect personally on your life and faith. And I would invite any and all comments concerning our church. All received will be shared with the Deacons as together we think about the spiritual welfare of our church.




January 5th ~ Saturday 4:30pm Service

Happy New Years! It's a cliché to write about commitment in January, but since it is January, why not? For many, many people the new year is a time to commit to working out, eating better, making new friends, attending church, adding a spiritual practice, and many more. Years ago, I decided to stop making new year's resolutions. Now I just recommit to living the next year as I try to live ever year: knowing that I have one life to live on this planet, and I will do everything in my power to live with joy, love, and compassion by spreading God's love and taking action to create a better world. While I was writing this article, I found out that many noteworthy people have written personal mission statements. I think I stumbled upon

this statement without realizing that it is a personal mission statement. Like many personal mission statements, it helps guide my life by cogently expressing what I feel to be my purpose on this planet. I fulfill this through being unafraid to be a Christian who preaches a message of love and acceptance; through helping young people understand their purpose; through marching in the streets; through working with a group to create more affordable housing; through attending to the pastoral needs of people in our church and to those who I meet. He healed many people regardless of their position in life. He drew people around him who desired healing and who desired to hear that they are loved. But shall I forget the Holy Spirit: no. The Holy Spirit has guided the church for two millennials leading us to new places and delivering the message of love in new ways through contemporaneous technology. The church has not always listened to the Holy Spirit, yet it continues to guide us. Women's Spirituality Group



MISSION OPPORTUNITIES

Missions Moment

For almost the past 10 years, Faith Formation has evolved into what it is today, including Hands-On Mission Sundays. We asked Laurie to tell us about how this evolution has taken place.



Soon after Laurie arrived as our Christian Education coordinator in

August of 2009, she realized that our congregation, like many others, had a hard time having enough leaders for the classes during school breaks and on holiday weekends. After a discussion with other CE members and staff, they decided to center all group activities in 2010 around the season at the time, the offering that had been chosen or a faith practice like praying or baking pretzels.

From 2010-2012, these activities went from being a rotation to stations that the children did in age groups where they would take part in seasonal hands-on activities in the peer rooms and rotate through them. In the fall of 2013, they were then called Group Activity Days and were turning into more of a full age group activity that would aid in building community among the children and youth and help them all get to know each other better as the children attending are from different schools as well as different towns, such as Colchester, Milton, Jericho, Williston, Essex Town, Essex Junction and Waterbury.

In the fall of 2017, another evolution took place and the name changed to Hands-On Mission Sundays. More and more parents were liking the idea of their children talking about and doing mission activities, so the name fit the activity.

In the Spring of 2018, Laurie came to the Missions Committee and asked us, as a committee, if we would like to be more connected and help brainstorm ideas and perhaps be more hands-on ourselves with these faith formation days. We assisted on a few of these days during the last curriculum year. As faith formation keeps evolving and church life keeps changing and families have more and more going on and the CE staff and committee try to keep families connected and involved, the programs will need to stay fresh and exciting. Laurie says that in the next few years, Hands-On will likely change once again.

Dismas House ~ Your Good Deed Will be Much Appreciated

Across Vermont there are four Dismas Houses that provide shelter and support for men and women who have served prison terms and are making the transition from life in prison to life outside. For several years now, First Congregational Church members have been serving dinner on the 4th Wednesday of each month to the residents of the Dismas House in Winooski. Our participation in this program is of great value in lessening the feelings of estrangement that burden many who have



served prison terms. The residents of Dismas House and the paid staff are friendly and appreciative of our help. The staff includes a paid Director and Associate Director who are at Dismas House during weekdays, including during the evening meal. Three of our members prepare the fourth Wednesday

dinner. One of us prepares an entry, another a salad, and a third, a dessert. After we've taken the food to Dismas house, we usually stay and enjoy the meal with the Dismas House residents and staff. 

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

Our Home, Our Future, Our Time...

We are making progress! On behalf of the Capital Campaign Steering Committee, we have several exciting project updates to share with you.



The other major work to be completed in 2019 is the Sanctuary Restoration Project, which includes the refurbishing of our historic windows and wooden blinds, plaster repair and a fresh coat of paint throughout the sanctuary (even the pews!). The sanctuary restoration was the number one priority identified by the congregation through our feasibility study, and doing this work will restore and preserve the beauty of **Our Home** for years to come. There will be an opportunity for the congregation to give input into a new sanctuary paint color once we have awarded a contract for the restoration work and we have a better sense of how long that project will take. We have applied for a Historic Preservation Grant to help cover some of our expenses. Grant decisions will be made in early December. Based on the report from historic architect specialist Sally Fishburn, we anticipate that the sanctuary will be open throughout these renovations. We will keep you updated if that changes. For more information about the window and plaster renovation project, Sally Fishburn's full report is available on our website under Capital Campaign Projects.

Last but not least, initial organ repair and maintenance work will take place in spring 2019, either before or after Easter and a contractor has been selected to replace the parsonage parking lot with pavers, which will also occur in the spring.

Thank you all for continuing to support the **Our Home, Our Future, Our Time Capital Campaign**. Our pledge total stands at \$935,616. We appreciate all of the pledge payments made so far, and all of the early pledge payments. As a result, we do not anticipate needing bridge loan financing to complete the projects above. We continue to accept new gifts for the campaign to help us "fill our heart" and reach our \$1.02 million stretch goal.
