#### Pastoral Prayer

Each week during Lent, we will begin our time of prayer by having each pew [or if alone in a pew, then pairing with the pew next to you] in focused dialogue about particular types of prayer. This will just take a small fraction of time and in the process we will learn some of the various ways Christians have deepened their relationship with God through pray.

On March 17th we will focus on Prayers of Petition

Prayers of Petition are prayers when we ask God for our own need; God asks us to pray for ourselves and delights in our asking; God's heart is warmed when we come to the divine for help. Indeed, prayers of petition are never answered without the asking! Petitionary prayer keeps us in right relationship to God for the asking deepens and enhances our relationship. God also simply likes to be included in the daily activities of our lives and to know our deepest needs. Sometimes just the asking, clarifies our need and adjusts our attitude to the divine and centers our journey in Christ's way of love; this in an of itself can produce answered prayers. There is also a mystery and power in prayer that cannot be explained: when we center our energy and focus our thoughts there are powerful consequences which can also be defined as answered prayer.

The Lord's Prayer includes many petitionary prayers. Not praying for your own circumstances also limits one of the most difficult and faithful discussions one will ever have with the divine: that of unanswered prayer.

Speak to your neighbor about one or two of your personal prayer petitions, then commit to praying for your neighbor's prayer this week.

Second Sunday of Lent

Luke 13:31-35 or Luke 9:28-36 (37-43a)

#### Strong and Tender

Lent is the season for uncomfortable questions and hard truths. Exactly what is needed to open our eyes and our hearts, and set our feet on the path of faithfulness? In today's Scripture, the petty tyrant Herod's vision of how things should be clashes with what Jesus is teaching as he travels around, right there on Herod's home turf. But Jesus brushes aside the warnings about Herod's evil scheming as only words that are insignificant when viewed in relation to the plan of God. Those in official positions of power, whether it's Herod in Galilee, Pilate in Jerusalem, or the mighty Roman Empire itself, can cause havoc.

During these six weeks of Lent, we take a hard look at the obstacles between us and God (obstacles that God didn't put there), not just on our own personal spiritual path, but also on the road toward a new world of justice, wholeness, and peace. Consider these three questions this week:

- 1. How can we reflect the selfless, unconditional love of Jesus in the world?
- 2. How can we embody "love of neighbor" in our public life?
- 3. How would Jesus be perceived in the halls of power today?

One Great Hour of Sharing, as part of Our Churches Wider Mission, is the special mission offering of the United Church of Christ that carries God's message of love and hope to people in crisis. The UCC works with international partners to provide sources of clean water, food, education and health care, small business micro-credit, advocacy and resettlement for refugees and displaced persons, and emergency relief and rehabilitation. One Great Hour of Sharing also supports domestic and international ministries for disaster preparedness and response.

Through One Great Hour of Sharing, lives are literally changed daily. Your support provides clean water, food, medicines, shelter, healthcare, education and so much more. In 2017, the OGHS offering received over \$2 million. Nearly sixty-five percent of UCC congregations participate annually.

On March 31st, members and friends of the United Church of Christ will have the opportunity to respond to all of these needs through One Great Hour of Sharing. Let's all give generously.
