This will keep us all healthy and better able to come to church! We begin this ancient ritual with the following words....

A Time of Confession

Call to Confession

Leader: It is easy to give up chocolate or caffeine for 40 days, but taking a look deep within one's self can be painful, scary, and exhausting. And yet we are called in this season of Lent to be different, to be intentional, to be reflective, to be penitent. So let us open ourselves to God's saving forgiveness.

People: Let us fear no more. God calls us to seek forgiveness, not because our Loving Creator revels in punishment, but because the Divine Presence longs to love us earnestly and openly. We pause before you Mighty One and seek your transforming grace.

Unison Prayer of Confession

Holy One it is easy to want to forgo Lent. It is no fun. It is not easy. Slow our minds, break free our burdened hearts, and heal our aching wounds. Help us to look within that we might begin to experience you in all your creation. Forgive us for not forgiving ourselves and recognizing you within our lives. Help us in letting go of old hurts and enliven us to begin to know you differently. Let this time of reflection be one of profound transformation: one in which we find ourselves within you in ways that dazzle and delight. Hear our silent confession as we seek to be more Christ like.

The Assurance of Pardon

Everyone: Majestic Spirit, we know in you there is no darkness. We celebrate that you bring light to the darkest of places. Thank you for loving us unconditionally and forever seeking to be in relationship with us. Amen!

Children's Message

During worship our staff person, Jennifer, is in the Nursery for children under 3 years. There is audio in there and the service is streamed to Fellowship Hall. After the Children's Message, preschool and kindergarteners are invited for a time of Faith Formation on the 2nd floor with our Spiritual Friends and all will return for Communion. Adults are welcome to accompany the kids, help them get settled and stay or return to worship.

God has made us all a rainbow. Colors dancing 'round and 'round. In our hair and skin and eyes, big and little, every size, God has made us all a rainbow dancing 'round. Jesus loves the little children, All God's children of the world. Whether young or old or new, Jesus loves us through and through Teaching us to love all creatures in the world.

Pastoral Prayer and Unison Lord's Prayer

Each week during Lent, we will begin our time of prayer by focusing on one type of prayer by practicing it and then sharing with the people in your pew or those closest to you, making sure that everyone in the church is connected. This will just take a small fraction of time and in the process we will learn some of the various ways Christians have prayed through the centuries.

This week, we will be focusing on Intercessory Prayer which are prayers offered on behalf of another or for those beyond yourself. These can be prayers for a loved one or friend. They can be for a people who are oppressed or struck with loss and misery. They can be for entire communities, nations, or even all of Creation.

These can be prayers for healing, peace, patience, forgiveness, recovery, hope, wholeness, and much more. Intercessory prayer moves us beyond ourselves and into the struggles of others. However, it is much more than simply empathizing with another. Prayers of Intercession invite us into a deeper relationship with God. Inviting us to have our hearts aligning with God's and praying for others to be deeply transformed by the presence of God in their lives.

After you spend time in intercessory prayer, speak to your neighbor about one or two of your personal prayers of intercession and ask them if they would include them in their own prayers.



Exodus and Exile: the most momentous experiences in ancient Israel's life. In each hour of need, God heard the cry of the people and sent prophets--Moses in Egypt, and prophets like Isaiah to the people in Babylon. For Israel, exile was being lost, homesick, divided, unmoored, rootless except for memory. It must have been hard to resist the temptation to settle down, fit in, sell out, and forget the story that had held them together. After all, what good had all that done them? Into that heartache and doubt stepped a poet-prophet to sing a new song about ancient things, and the new thing that the God of old was about to do.
