

A Pastor's ponderings.....

On Easter morning it felt good to finally be able to say alleluia as our children handed us the word on a brightly colored piece of paper and as we sang that "Christ the Lord is Risen today." The children, as always, offered us hope for the future. But coming together as one to proclaim life in the midst of death and hope in the midst of despair despite being a diverse community with different backgrounds, beliefs and political opinions is another sign of hope. After all, the hymn we start the day with proclaims that 'Jesus is Risen', not that he rose long ago. The favorite old hymn doesn't talk about what happened 2000 years ago but what is happening today!

Today, we are united in our saddened hearts for Christians that were singled out for death on Easter day in Sri Lanka, as we were saddened when our Muslim brothers and sisters were singled out in New Zealand a couple of weeks previously. Despite the continued violence, it seems to me that people of good conscience, even from varied religious backgrounds, are coming together to say enough! Violence against anyone based on religion and the way they practice it is simply wrong! Just think if that could become the acceptable and normative way we thought about these killings....a huge intellectual jump from thousands of years of thinking and needless bloodshed. We are moving ever closer to Christ's ways of peace.

This coming Sunday, a day that will be over by the time you read this article, we will have celebrated seven years as an Open and Affirming Church. Our vote way back in 2012 was 97-3 and not one person left the church over the vote. Since that time, we have slowly continued to live into an identity where everyone is welcome regardless of their sexual orientation, political persuasion or their understanding of a specific doctrine! Some might see this as weakness, but I see it as an incredible strength and being in synch with Jesus and his message of love. Together, all of us are building the community that Jesus starting building so long ago, a community and way of thinking he died for and a community that he arose to continue to lead and inspire. Yes, welcoming everyone into the fold affirms Christ's resurrection and offers us hope for the future.

In a lesser degree, but maybe not for true Congregationalists, it was also a near miracle to have voted on the color of the sanctuary without spilling blood or having anyone leave in a huff. With an 88 - 55 - 14 vote, the clear choice of the yellowish tinted color with white trim was a clear victor. But everyone seemed excited to be closer to having a sanctuary that is beautiful. With all the work going on in the vestry and the soon to be started parking lot and sanctuary work, it is thrilling to finally be seeing the results. And in spending almost a million dollars, not one major rift or conflict has occurred in the process....dare I say another sign of resurrection hope.

Finally, we can all agree, that after such a harsh winter, springtime is nature's way of saying that winter is over and new life continues to spring all around us.

To all of you, celebrate Eastertide and atone your eyes to see and your ears to hear the resurrected hope all around us.

ASSOCIATE PASTOR NEWS

Happy Easter!

I will be away for most of the Easter season. As of this writing, I haven't had surgery yet. I expect to be in recovery for four weeks. Meaning I should be back towards the end of May or beginning of June. Thank you for your prayers and support over these last few months. The surgery, hopefully, will lead to long term relief, and if you can believe, to me having more energy!

We are starting to put together Confirmation for next year. When I was in Confirmation in a fundamentalist version of Lutheranism, I was required for three years every Wednesday night to sit down and listen to the pastor lecture about doctrine, creeds, learning about Luther: it was not exciting. We were required to write down what the pastor said and to listen obediently. There wasn't much room for questioning what he said. I despised it. Wednesday nights became my most dreaded night of the year. Let me just say, that's not how I roll.

Our confirmation class helps participants explore who they are, become more acquainted with their values. We expect questions and to be challenged. We do this by learning about Christianity past and present, attending worship services of different Christian congregations and going to other non-Christian religious traditions, exploring the biblical stories through an imaginative lens, and so much more. One of the best ways to experience God is through service. Confirmation next time will have one major service project or several smaller service projects for the group to plan. At the end of Confirmation, our participants are welcome to affirm their faith, if they so choose, and to articulate their values and faith, as they understand it at that time.

We would like to expand the length of the Confirmation process. Instead of a one-year program like in the years past, we would like to do a two-year program. Youth who are in eighth and ninth grades would start the program next Fall 2019 and be confirmed in Spring 2021. In the past, we've even had adults join us, like Trista, so adults are welcome. A one-year program means we often miss or are not able to fully discuss the history of the church, the Bible, faith, spirituality, other religious traditions: with a two-year program, we can. A two-year program would also help the group cohere and help Mark and I develop a deeper connection with the group.

Finally with Confirmation, we understand that a two-year program requires a lengthier commitment. Let us know if a two-year program is reasonable. I don't think it will be every week like in the past, but we might modify the schedule. We are here to receive your feedback. Thanks!

To continue to connect the life of our faith throughout the year, we're looking at making sandwiches in July, serving them to people who are homeless in our area, and then we'd gather together afterwards for a debrief and a fun activity. This would be a combined Junior Youth Group and High School Youth Group gathering. Please, keep an eye on for a Doodle Poll in early June.

With Laurie's Christian Education research trip complete, Laurie and I will be sending out a form this month or next month to survey our Christian Education programs, ranging from faith formation on Sunday mornings to our youth groups and to other programs that might be of interest. Our hope is to incorporate

some of the best practices other congregations are using and that fit our congregation. I invite you to attend Laurie's presentation. The survey will help us better understand the time commitments, general interests, and other areas germane to Christian Education and faith formation.

I look forward to being back!

Connecting with the wider church, seeing and hearing about other churches and their ministry, as well as doing the work of the conference is something that I have done since I arrived here at First and continue to enjoy it. It's very educational and I would encourage others to take a leap and attend next year. You can also connect to the wider church ministry by getting involved in outdoor ministry and volunteer at camp for a day or a week or even joining the VT OM Team and help with planning, recruiting and advertising. Another thing on my list is to continue looking for volunteer counselors to travel with me to Horton Center in NH in July to spend a very rewording week with young youth in God's great outdoors, help them get closer to their God and to possibly step a little out of their comfort zone. This week at the VT Annual Meeting I will also be able to spend time again with my traveling partner, Jennifer Smith from the Congregational Church of Middlebury, who was with me on my travels to CT and MA. We have both had a busy Lent and this time together will be catching up on what has been happening in our churches, but it will also give me a chance to share with her what I saw and learned on my trip to OR & WA.

Back in March I returned from the west coast. This was my last of the three trips visiting other UCC churches, interviewing staff and talking about their vibrant ministry programs and how they work, getting a tour of their building and hearing how they stay vibrant. Thank you all SO much for your support, encouragement, interest and your time that so many of you put into our programs while I was away, helping them to run smoothly in my absence. A special thanks to our CE team and all our program volunteers. You all are awesome and I could not have done these trips without all of your support. I came back and walked right into Lent, a busy and full six weeks of ministry here. In between planning for our programs I found time to work on my PowerPoint presentation of the research trips to CT, MA, OR & WA and my written report. I presented my presentation to our CE team at their April meeting and will present a shorter version to Council at their May meeting. Many of you have asked about my trips and have voiced that you would like to hear about them, so on Sunday May 19th, following our second service (around 11:30am in Fellowship Hall), I will do a presentation for the full church with time for you to ask questions. I hope you will put this on your calendars and stay to join in the conversation. All the churches I visited are very active, full of life and ministry and looking forward.

One of the things that I learned and saw on my travels was a slightly different Sunday morning format style for children and youth. This idea went right along with how Pastor Josh and I envisioned moving forward for next year. In order to implement this change we shared with CE our vision of flipping a couple of our faith formation program rooms. CE really liked the idea. So, I invite you all to keep walking the full building as you looking around to see all the changes taking shape. Most of our program rooms will be getting new windows and we are looking for volunteers to help us give them all a fresh new coat of paint, helping our ministry stay vibrant and relevant in these changing times.

The residents and staff are friendly and appreciative of our help. The dinner we take consists of an entrée, salad, and dessert. We bring enough food to feed 15 people and stay to enjoy the meal with the Dismas House residents and staff.
