ASSOCIATE PASTOR NEWS

Thank you all for your prayers of support during my surgery and with the loss of my grandpa. As I've said to folks, my 30s have not started off great. Your care and support during my acute stage with Crohn's Disease and more recently with the death in my family has meant a lot to me and helped sustain me. FCCEJ is filled with so many wonderful people. I feel incredibly lucky to minister to you and to be ministered by you. Our ministry together has grown immensely during this time. Thank you.

My surgery on April 23rd went well with about six inches of my intestines being removed. The intestines leading to the obstructed area were significantly dilated, meaning the surgery should lead to overall improvements to my health—time will tell. I have an ileostomy pouch until June 25th went it will be reversed. That surgery is an overnight and requires a few days of recovery. My grandpa unexpectedly passed away during my recovery. I flew to Wisconsin, almost two weeks post-surgery, to be with my family. Thankfully my mom had flown out to Vermont to be with me as I recovered at the parsonage, and we were able to travel back to Wisconsin together. There were no difficulties while flying but it was and added comfort to fly with my mom. As she said, we can add another milestone to our mother/son relationship: flying together! When I was in Wisconsin, my grandma asked that I stay with her. She wasn't comfortable staying at the house alone. I was privileged to be able to do that and stay with her.

As I say that one of the greatest relationships that can exist is between a grandchild with a grandparent or between child and a caring wise elder. It's why it's so important for us to develop meaningful relationships with each of our young people. When young people know that there is someone there for them, they feel more connected to their church and feel more supported in life.

This is what research tells us will keep them connected to the church even after they graduate from high school. It is what will bring them back during college and help them reach out and find a church after they graduate from college.

Please call me, drop me a line or stop by my office and chat about being a Spiritual Friend on 1st Sundays, a peer group leader or helper, a Hands On Mission leader or helper, a 2nd floor greeter or floater, or a behind the scenes steward. Leaders need to have been a part of our community for 6 months before taking on this role.

Jamaica Mission Trip – Collecting School Supplies

The Jamaica team is in the process of gathering donations of school supplies to bring with us. The principal of White Horses Infant and Primary School has provided a list of items that are most needed at the school. Please consider donating an item. Jamaica Team Volunteers at COTS

As part of our fundraising efforts at the Calcutta this year, the Jamaica Team auctioned off two hours of our time to the highest bidder. The winner generously donated our time to the Committee on Temporary Shelter (COTS)! On May 1st, we went to COTS' 95 North Avenue building to help with preparations for the COTS Walk. We were treated to a tour of the facility by Becky Holt, the Development and Communications Coordinator.



We learned a lot about the wonderful programs there and the careful and thoughtful recent renovation of the building. For example, they had surveyed the guests who requested mailboxes, showers and laundry



machines. The guests also requested single comfortable armchairs instead of couches, in order to have a better sense of personal space. These requests were all included, as well as other "trauma-informed" features (in recognition that many homeless adults and children have had trauma in their lives). To this end, the ceiling in the day center was designed to create a sense of spaciousness, but also provide sound reduction. Meals are served family style at round tables, to increase the sense of community. After the tour, we were put to work on a paper project making "thought bubbles" to be used at the COTS facilities on the day of the Walk. We're so thankful to everyone who made this possible!

Dismas House ~ Your Good Deed Will be Much Appreciated

Across Vermont there are four Dismas Houses that provide shelter and support for men and women who have served prison terms and are making the transition from life in prison to life outside. For several years now, on the fourth Wednesday of each month, three First Congregational Church members have been preparing dinner for the residents and staff of the Dismas House in Winooski. Attending the meal are typically ten residents, two paid staff members (a Director and Associate Director who work at Dismas House during weekdays), and the three members of the Church who have prepared the food.



Our participation in this program is of great value in lessening the feelings of estrangement that burden many who have served prison terms. The residents and staff are friendly and appreciative of our help. The dinner we take consists of an entrée, salad, and dessert. We bring enough food to feed 15 people and stay to enjoy the meal with the Dismas House residents and staff.
