## Our Faith, Our Voice, Our Vote

***"Don't burn out; keep yourselves fueled and aflame. Be alert servants of the Master, cheerfully expectant. Don't quit in hard times; pray all the harder. Help needy Christians; be inventive in hospitality."*** - Romans 12:12 MSG

In 2018, the Neighbors in Need special mission offering and grant pool committee examined the ways in which it could spotlight, the UCC identity and missional initiative: 3 Great Loves campaign, **LOVE OF NEIGHBOR**. Emmaus United Church of Christ, in Vienna, Virginia, applied and received a \$3,500 NIN grant to aid them to work for justice within their community. They partnered with **VOICE** (Virginians Organized for Interfaith Community Engagement) in hopes of a securing the outcome they desired.

Emmaus UCC senior pastor, Rev. Kristen McBrayer shares, "In 2018 we set out to listen to our neighbors. We learned that the greatest concerns in our schools this year are student support for mental health counselors as well as the retention of 'good teachers'. From these listening sessions and meetings with key leaders, we set forth an agenda to increase the funding for mental health counselors so that students have a 250:1 ratio. This ratio is the minimum needed to provide basic support for our students. Retaining our best teachers is key to the success of our school system. Increasing teacher pay is essential to this goal."

Additionally, Rev. McBrayer reports, "In October, 1,300 people from our VOICE institutions met with Virginia's Governor and Attorney General to ask for their support on our agenda. Among those present were more than 600 students, parents, and teachers concerned about our schools. The Governor continues to work with VOICE on funding for mental health and good teacher pay and we believe the ground work we did in 2018 has set the stage for some big wins for our students in the 2019 budget cycle and general assembly."

As people of faith, we are encouraged to advocate for all those who are marginalized by institutional systems as well as individuals. Being able to use one's voice, even at the ballot box, is a key to fulfilling that biblical missional mandate. We are proud to have been a partner with Emmaus UCC as they embarked to make a difference in their community to aid their neighbors in need.

# Capital Campaign Update

Thank you to the volunteers who spent a few hours last Saturday working on the gardens around our NEW sign out front! *Cathy Shearer, Carl Wermer, Kevin & Sena Meilleur, Lester & Muriel Nutting, Francis Gravel & Gary Hartmann, Josh Simon & Kaki McGeary.*

We are awaiting final approval of a federal grant that will pay for the new exterior light fixtures. We need to wait until we have a grant contract in place before we can use those funds, so this has delayed installation of the new lighting. We anticipate that the lights will be installed some time in November. We are aware that this causes some inconvenience, but the delay will save us about \$10,000 if we can use federal grant funds for that work instead of paying for it with Campaign funds.

Work on the historic windows continues. The new custom storm windows look beautiful (and they work!) and we are eagerly awaiting the re-installation of the refurbished windows and shutters some time this month. We have also had a crew of volunteer painters working throughout the church to give things a face lift... perhaps you have noticed the fresh coat of paint in the foyer outside Fellowship Hall and in the hallway upstairs outside the elevator. Thank you John and Donna Burnett, Laurie Chipman, Mark Mendes, Carolyn Rushford and Kaki McGeary for working on this. And thank you to Cathy Shearer for painting in the Sawyer House. I hope we haven't forgotten someone!!

We now turn our attention to planning the Sanctuary plaster repair/painting, the Marvin Lounge and the Kitchen.

Some years ago, there was a bumper sticker popular with members and friends of the United Church of Christ, “To believe is to care, to care is to do.” This slogan was a reminder that love is not passive. Love is an action word. Those bumper stickers aren’t around anymore, but we are still encouraged to focus on active love as we lift up Three Great Loves – love of neighbor, love of children and love of creation.

According to [www.ucc.org/nin](http://www.ucc.org/nin), Neighbors in Need (NIN) is a special mission offering of the United Church of Christ that supports ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States and this year will focus on one of the #3greatloves, love of children.

One-third of NIN funds support the Council for American Indian Ministry(CAIM). Two-thirds of this offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Local Church Ministries (JLCM) to support a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects through grants, which are awarded to UCC churches and organizations doing justice work in their communities. These grants fund projects whose work ranges from direct service to community organizing and advocacy to address systemic injustice.

There are many ways for individuals and organizations to be inspired to work with these types of programs and projects. There are many paths toward justice. One of these is the path of grief born of love.

Parents whose children have been lost to school gun violence may become local or even national advocates for gun safety. Others grieving the destruction of a favorite wetland to unfettered development may become climate rights activists. Still others experience the pain of racism against those they love and become Black Lives Matter activists.

Of course, sometimes, as in the psalm today, the action born of our grief and love can be destructive. Jesus modeled for us another way. Jesus shows that action originating in loving grief can be generative, creative, and sustainable.

On this World Communion Sunday, we recall our connection with Christians around the world. As we do so, let us remember that communion was an act originated by Jesus that grew from his love and his grief. As he ate with his friends for what he knew would be the last time, he broke bread and took up the cup.

Those actions anticipated the justice of the reign to come, when all will gather at the table of plenty. Those actions, born in a moment of grief, remain one of the most powerful ways those who live in this name can continue to recall that love is an action word.
