In 1935 when it was written, it was called "a message to thinking Americans". It is a novel that remains as fresh and contemporary as today's news.

Capital Campaign Update By Kaki McGeary



Thank you to the volunteers who spent a few hours last Sunday to clean-out and pare down our kitchen supplies and gear! Who knew we had so many punch bowls? Thank you Jim Glatz, Jenny Bourn, Ginny Coe, MJ Allen, Kaki McGeary and Val Gabert! We got rid of the things we no longer use, things that no longer function well, and things that many, many duplicates. We re-organized all

that was left so hopefully things will be easier to find and use. This project was a huge help to the Capital Campaign as we think about our storage needs and how the kitchen can be efficient and user-friendly for all who use it.

Security Grant/Lighting News - we got the grant! We received a federal grant of \$47,809 for improving security and safety at our church. This grant award includes \$10,000 for new parking lot lights! Also included are funds to add locks to all of our classroom doors and a new "controlled access system" (keyless locks, video cameras at our two main entrances). Now we are just waiting on paperwork. :) Once we have it, we will install the new lighting in the parking lot! The other projects will take a bit longer to implement, so stay tuned for details.

Window Update: We are eagerly awaiting the return of our historic windows/shutters in the sanctuary. We hope they will be back by the end of November.

AND....COMING SOON: The Sanctuary Restoration Project!

The Sanctuary Restoration Project will begin January 1. As we shared before, the plaster ceiling must be totally removed and replaced. This work will require temporary scaffolding. The entire project should take about 2 months, assuming no major hiccups. The ceiling work will be done first and then it must cure for several weeks, during which time the walls will be patched. Once that is done, painting can begin!

Unfortunately, the Sanctuary will not be usable while the scaffolding is in place. Worship services will be held in Fellowship Hall starting on December 29. Our goal is to be back in the sanctuary BEFORE PALM SUNDAY, if not before. Our staff and several committees are working on plans to make this temporary move as seamless and comfortable as possible. We appreciate everyone's patience and flexibility as we get through those few months. We ask for prayers that we move through this time of transition and mess with patience, kindness, grace and humor, and that this experience might draw us closer together as one body of Christ.

As we continue to work on these projects, we are drawing down our cash balance. Your continued pledge payments are vital to our efforts! We have budgeted for bridge loan financing, and while we have not needed it yet, we will likely need to secure a bridge loan for the Sanctuary Restoration. As always, early pledge payments are welcome to help minimize bridge loan interest.

Transforming Love
Luke 19:1-10

Doesn't everyone belong in the arms of the Sacred? -Lady Gaga

Christ has no body now on earth but yours, no hands but yours, no feet but yours, yours are the eyes through which Christ's compassion is to look out to the earth, yours are the feet by which He is to go about doing good and yours are the hands by which He is to bless us now. - Teresa of Avila

If you study a scholarly interpretation of the story of Zacchaeus, the scholar might note drily that in first century Palestine, it would have caused a tremendous loss of face for a grown man to climb a tree. It's not just first century Palestinian society, however, that looks askance at grown men climbing trees. It does not take a tremendous stretch of the modern imagination to picture the ridiculousness of this scene.

Zacchaeus must have had very little left to lose in order to allow himself to be humiliated in this way. The branches of sycamore are welcoming and offer copious cover. So why did he come out of hiding? Why expose himself to more embarrassment and ridicule? When Jesus saw Zacchaeus and called him down out of the tree, why did Zacchaeus come down? He could have stayed up in the tree and hidden from Jesus and from the crowd. After all, it was-

n't just the tree climbing that made him an object of scorn. The people hated him because he was a tax collector and they believed he had cheated them.

But Zacchaeus heard Jesus calling him and saying his name, and he made a risky but life-giving choice. It did not take too much persuading on the part of Jesus. In their short exchange, Jesus offered Zacchaeus three precious gifts – Jesus saw him, Jesus invited him, and Jesus loved him. These three gifts had the immediate effect of transforming Zacchaeus.

In a moment, it seems, Zacchaeus decided to change his ways. Because he was seen, and invited and loved, he was able to reconcile with this God and his community. This radical change did not take a miracle on the part of Jesus. It just took a compassionate moment of connection

Teresa of Avila, the medieval mystic, reminds us that we are not just to follow Christ, but to be his hands and feet in the world. So, do this. Walk toward those on the margins and reach out your hand. Let those who feel unseen know they are seen. Extend an invitation to all. And radiate Christ's love wherever you go. We are Christ's hands and feet, and we can be the means by which even the most lost know that they are welcome "in the arms of the Sacred."
