Acolytes

Every Sunday we carry in the light of Christ and light the worship candles. Then during our sung benediction we carry out the light of Christ to remind us all that God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit are with us everywhere we go, not just here at church. Ushers are asked to help and assist the acolytes by lighting the taper, then walking with them if they are new to acolyting or would

like a partner. Older children or youth are also encourage to be acolytes. Families who are ushering or greeting can acolyte. Please check the signup sheet on the bulletin board down it the hallway on your way up to worship to see if someone has already signed up. Thank you.

Ring the Bell

All children and their families are welcome to ring the church bell 15 minutes before each worship service. Signup sheet is located on the bulletin board before you walk up the steps to worship (beside the Acolyte signup). Please check this first to see if someone has already signed up to ring the bell. Instructions are at the top of the sheet as to which rope to pull and how many times to ring the bell. It's fun to ring the church bell ring!



Capital Campaign Update **By Kaki McGeary**

COMING SOON: The Sanctuary Restoration Project!

Our historic windows are in the process of being put back - hooray! The big Sanctuary Restoration Project will begin January 1. As we shared before, the plaster ceiling must be



totally removed and replaced. This work will require temporary scaffolding and we will not be able to use the sanctuary during this time. The entire project should take about 2 months, assuming no major hiccups. The ceiling work will be done first and then it must cure for several weeks, during which time the walls will be patched. Once that is done, painting can begin!

Worship services will be held in Fellowship Hall starting on December 29.

Our goal is to be back in the sanctuary **BEFORE PALM SUNDAY**, if not before. Our staff and several committees are working on plans to make this temporary move as seamless and comfortable as possible. We ask for prayers that we move through this time of transition and mess with patience, kindness, grace and humor, and that this experience might draw us closer together as one body of Christ. We appreciate your flexibility and patience!

Lighting Update - We are working with the electrician to install parking lot, sign and steeple lights as soon as possible. Federal grant funds will pay for the parking lot fixtures.
