A Pastor's Ponderings

During my first Christmas as a pastor, I learned very quickly how the Christmas season is fraught with emotion. My life had been fairly sheltered so I tended to see Christmas as a joyous holiday where people sing carols, you receive presents and you celebrate the gift of family. As a young pastor, my overly optimistic emotional outlook was mitigated by the pain that so many people brought with them to the Christmas Eve services. So very many parishioners shed tears during the hymns as memories of loved ones long gone come flooding back into their consciousness. Parents mourned children who died tragically or died before seeing the light of day complications due to or beyond circumstances their control. Widow and widowers who sit alone but remember their spouses who had sat next to them for years, in the same pew, first with and then without their People sitting with children. disease on their mind or poor health that threatens to disrupt their health and lifestyle. Busy parents on the cusp of financial ruin and yet spend too much on gifts and food so that for just once during the year they might see kids celebrate freelv. their Worrying family members or

their addicted loved ones who feel the weight of life slipping into darkness. For some reason, I have learned that the Christmas season brings out both hope and anguish. often at the same time. I find it ironic that it is the one time people swarm to and fill the church to the brim. Why would one want to come to a place where there will be such a mixture of sentiment, a veritable roller coaster of emotion?

And with the state of the world and our country, it only adds to the fray. I always struggle with the Isaiah text that says that the descendent of David will come into the world and be the Prince of Peace and that his authority will grow and there will be endless peace and justice for the oppressed. Well, I struggle because Jesus has come but I do not always see his kingdom of life, peace and justice growing; And I do not see Jesus claiming an ever increasing authority in the world. There are movements of justice, strides toward freedom, periods when the resources of the world are more fairly distributed and moments when the love he preached about is so palpable that my eyes tear up and my heart swells. But like Christmas Eve in church, there is quite a mixture of good and evil, justice and injustice, love and hate in this world.

Then I read the story again and see that our reality is no different from when Jesus was born in the There was family manger. tension and shame associated with Christ's birth. They were poor and Mary's Magnificat rails eloquently about the rich being brought low and the lowly being lifted up. The wise men bring gifts and shepherds hear the angels sing of glory but Herod seeks his death and young mothers weep desperate tears of anguish. The multitude flock to Jesus and his words but the religious authorities and well positioned patrons detest his challenge and put him down. There is death....and life anew.

As we enter this sacred and well beaten season, I wonder if it might be so because of the mixture, for it is true to life. We all bring joys and anguish with us wherever we journey. We all celebrate life and mourn those we miss every day. In one moment, we can see glory and experience the ecstasies of life and the next journey through the valley of the shadow of death.

Perhaps the allure of the season is that in the midst of such drudgery and degradation, we are able to rise above and be joyful, hopeful and loving. Despite being self-centered, we can put other people first as we find the right gifts and donate to folks in need of a hand up. We be anxious about all sorts of various goings on in our world but there comes a time to be at peace and enjoy this life that God has given us so freely. The Good News is that humanity has always been able to overcome obstacles and make it to a better day. Every generation decries the next not taking care of the business of the world and yet here we are trying to figure out how to move forward. The message of the Christ Child is that God empowers, inspires and guides us forward bit by bit, once child at a time, one step forward at a time.

Come, join me this holiday season as we all pledge to follow that star...

O Come, O Come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel. That mourns in lonely exile here, until the Child of God appear. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel. O Come, O Come, Emmanuel is one of my favorite Advent hymns. Emmanuel means God with us. In times of despair before Jesus was born, the people found comfort in the words of the prophet Isaiah promising for Emmanuel, God with us, to walk among the people. They waited for someone who would walk among them and remove the evil that plagued the land of Israel, the occupying force of the Roman Empire. Jesus didn't destroy the occupying force and violence still plagues the world. Sometimes we do not receive exactly what we had hoped for instead we received the presence of God manifested in Jesus. We spend Advent waiting for Jesus to be born. This year we hear the story leading to his birth according to the Gospel of Matthew. The Gospel of Matthew focuses on Joseph and the visions he had with angels. Joseph is a young man. He is engaged to Mary. He learns that she is pregnant. He's about to end his engagement with her when an angel visited him in a dream telling him that Mary's pregnancy is from the Holy Spirit and he will be known as Emmanuel, God with us. God walked among the poor, the hopeless, the oppressed, those who were trying to find meaning in their lives, and more. God the Son walked among us. He taught us his ways and he showed us his power to heal through his miracles. He experienced the pain and joy human beings feel. He celebrated at a wedding, broke bread and fishes with thousands, cried over Jerusalem and its people, and was brutalized. We spend Advent waiting for God's presence by singing songs like O Come, O Come, Emmanuel, Keep Awake, Be Always Ready, and Comfort, Comfort O My People. I invite you to spend Advent as if we lived in world where Jesus is not yet born and allow for the waiting, the expectation of his birth to grow week after week. Then when Christmas arrives, we sing with joy for the birth of Jesus, the return of God's presence.

As I write this ()article I am pulling together items for our Advent Decorating Event that will happen this Sunday, November 24th, sponsored by CE and the Deacons. It's a time to gather with old friends and new friends and make nativity set pieces (for your family or as a gift) and decorate the Sanctuary for the seasons of Advent and Christmas. This year Advent, the beginning of a new year on the church calendar, starts on December 1st. There are four Sundays in Advent that lead us Christmas and our Advent wreath that we light during worship will help us count down the Sundays, but also remind us that God gave us the gift of hope, peace, joy and love.

With each New Year comes change and this year will be no different. It will start with our Spiritual Friend program on the first Sundays which has been for our PreK and Kindergarten children as we know their little bodies have a hard time sitting still in worship for the full hour. We can use a few more adult helpers for rehearsals and on this special Sunday. Please be in touch and let me know which days' work for you.

December 1st is also the deadline that Pastor Josh and I have set up for all youth (ages 12 to 20) to sign up who are

<u>Our Home, Our Future,</u> <u>Our Time...</u> Capital Campaign Update

Advent is a time of waiting and preparation for the coming of Jesus, a time to make room in our hearts for Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. This year, as we enter the season of Advent, we are also awaiting and preparing for several wonderful Capital Campaign projects!

Sanctuary Restoration Project

The Sanctuary Restoration Project will begin right after Christmas! Starting on December

29, worship services will be held in Fellowship Hall. The entire plaster ceiling must be totally removed and replaced. The ceiling will be done first and then it must cure for several weeks, during which time the walls will be patched. Once that is done, painting can begin! The entire project should take about 2 months, assuming no major hiccups.

Our goal is to be back in the sanctuary BEFORE PALM SUNDAY, if not before. Our staff and several committees are working on plans to make this temporary move as seamless and comfortable as possible. We ask for prayers that we move through this time of transition and mess with patience, kindness, grace and humor, and that this experience might draw us closer together as one body of Christ. This is a onceevery-hundred year's type of project! We cannot wait to share this beautiful transformation with everyone during Holy Week 2020.

Sanctuary Windows

We eagerly await the return of our historic windows/shutters in the sanctuary. We HOPE they will be back by the end of November.

Security Grant / Outdoor Lighting

We got the grant! We received a federal grant of \$47,809 for improving security and safety at our church. This grant award includes \$10,000 for new parking lot lights! Also included are funds to add locks to all of our

classroom doors and а new "controlled access system" (keyless locks, video cameras at our two main entrances). Now we are just waiting on paperwork. :) Once we have it, we will install the new lighting in the parking lot! The other projects will take a bit longer to implement, so stay tuned for details. In the meantime, we are hoping to have lights for the steeple, church sign and thrift shop sign re-installed soon.

Pledge Payment Reminder

Your continued pledge payments are vital to our efforts! As we continue to work on major projects, we are drawing down our available cash balance. While we have not needed a bridge loan yet, we will likely need one to do the Sanctuary Restoration.

BYLAWS UPDATES

The congregation will vote on proposed updates to our existing Bylaws at the Annual Meeting in January 2020. Copies of the Bylaws, with these updates included and highlighted, will be available in Church in December. Meeting(s) will be scheduled to allow members to ask any questions they have about the changes and a summary sheet describing some of the more significant will be ones provided. Meeting dates will be shared via announcements at Church and in the bulletin.

"Your Good Deed Will be Much Appreciated" [Republished from the November 2019 SPIRT@FIRST Issue]

What is Dismas House? Across Vermont there are four Dismas Houses that provide shelter and support for men and women who have served prison terms and are making the transition from life in prison to life outside.

For several years now, on the fourth Wednesday of each month, three folks who attend our Church have been preparing dinner for the residents and staff of the Dismas House in Winooski. One of us prepares an entrée, another a salad, and a third a dessert. The three of us usually stay to enjoy the meal with the Dismas House residents and staff. They are friendly and appreciative of our help. By participating in the program, we help to lessen the feelings of estrangement that burden folks who have served prison terms.

Want to volunteer? If you have never been to Dismas House and would like to volunteer, at least one person from the Church who has already been to Dismas House will be going there on the Wednesday you sign up for. There is a sign-up sheet that's on the bulletin board in the hall leading to the Church's social hall.

How many? Attending the meal are typically ten residents, two paid staff members (a Director and Associate Director who work there during weekdays), and the three of us from the Church who have prepared the food.


