Capital Campaign Update

Sanctuary Restoration Project Update!

Worship Services will be held in Fellowship Hall while the sanctuary is closed for restoration (starting Sunday Dec. 29 through Palm Sunday).

As we shared before, our plaster ceiling must be totally removed and replaced. This work will require temporary scaffolding and we will not be able to use the sanctuary during this time. The entire project should take about 2 months, assuming no major hiccups. The ceiling work will be done first and then it must cure for several weeks, during which time the walls will be patched. Once that is done, painting can begin.

Our staff and several volunteers have developed plans to make this temporary move as seamless and comfortable as possible. We ask for prayers that we move through this time of transition with flexibility and grace. We look forward to seeing you all in our new space on Sunday mornings starting right after Christmas!

Lighting Update—We are working with the electrician to install parking lot, sign and steeple lights as soon as possible. Federal grant funds will pay for the parking lot fixtures.

Pledge Payments—Your continued pledge payments are vital to our efforts! We

have budgeted for bridge loan financing. While we have not needed it yet, our cash balance is getting low and we will likely need to secure a bridge loan for the Sanctuary Restoration. As always, early pledge payments are welcome to minimize interest expenses.



December 15, 2019 Third Sunday of Advent **Heartbeat of Justice** Luke 1:46b-55

Look around the room. Everyone's circumstances were unique, but every person you see has at least one thing in common – every person here was born. And before they were born, they were carried in a womb.

Look around the world. Everyone's circumstances were unique but every person you see has this in common – every person on this planet we call home was born. And before they were born, every person was carried in a womb.

However you were born, the first sounds you heard were the muffled but persistent sound of the mother's heartbeat. The heartbeat of the woman's body that carries the baby is the first sound that the child can hear. Every language records it differently, but in most every language, the word we use for that first sound is as rhythmic and beautiful as a two-word poem. Lub dub, lub dub, those who speak English say. Around the world, mothers' hearts beat, saying duru duru (Bengali), deg deg (Indonesian), pam pam (Albanian), tuks tuks (Estonian), peng peng (Chinese), bum bum (Spanish), ratama ratama (Arabic), doki doki (Japanese).

After its mother's heart, the second sound a fetus can hear is the sound of their mother's voice. Like the heartbeat, to every baby in the world, this voice sounds the same. Individual words are not distinguished – just the musical cadence of the sound of her voice.

Now look at Jesus. His story is unique, but he is like us in this way. He was born. And before he was born, he was carried in a womb. Like us, he heard a heartbeat. Like us, he heard the cadence of his mother's voice. What did it mean for Jesus to have the first words he heard be this song - a longing of a justice?
