The Sanctuary Restoration Project has begun! Scaffolding is up and work to replace our plaster **CONSTRUCTION** ceiling will begin soon. As we shared before, our plaster ceiling must be totally removed and replaced. The ceiling work will be done first and then it must cure for

several weeks, during which time the walls will be patched. Once that is done, painting can begin.

Worship services will be held in Fellowship Hall while the sanctuary is closed for restoration (Sunday Dec. 29 through Palm Sunday). We look forward to worshipping with you in our new temporary space while construction is underway. Thank you for your patience and flexibility!
