**Our Church is a thriving community with great activity and expanding programs.** We've seen growth in our youth ministry. This year we had 16 youth participate in the Christmas Pageant, over 50 children and youth learn about God's love for them at our Vacation Bible Camp, have seen our Junior Youth program increase to 24 overall youth, and we have 9

youth in confirmation. Last year, we helped send 16 young people and adults to Jamaica to be the hands of Christ. Our Sermon Talk back group had 27 people coming last week and continues to draw over 20 people each week. The Joy Group filled the Marvin Lounge as they listened to Bob Vincent and Ann Gray talk church history. Friday morning Coffee Clatter get upwards of ten people many weeks. Our many musical groups continue to produce magnificent music and inspire us all on a weekly basis. We sponsored more kids through our Christmas Giving Tree program than ever before and continue to be a leader in the community in feeding people. And in 2020, through the Capital Campaign projects, we're going to have a new ceiling and fresh coat of paint to revitalize our beautiful Sanctuary.

Because so many of our programs are successful, committees asked for more financial resources to help sustain our many vibrant ministries. We need extra help making sure our budget is balanced and our ministries maintained. **Please consider revising your 2020 pledge by \$2-7 per week to help sustain our vibrant ministries and our ability to spread the love of God in tangible ways.** As many of you know, I've had two surgeries this year and multiple medical bills. I originally was going to lower my pledge. # Capital Campaign Update

Sanctuary Restoration Project Update! Worship Services will be held in Fellowship Hall while the sanctuary is closed for restoration (**starting Sunday Dec. 29 through Palm Sunday**).

As we shared before, our plaster ceiling must be totally removed and replaced. This work will require temporary scaffolding and we will not be able to use the sanctuary during this time. The entire project should take about 2 months, assuming no major hiccups. The ceiling work will be done first and then it must cure for several weeks, during which time the walls will be patched. Once that is done, painting can begin. Our staff and several volunteers have developed plans to make this temporary move as seamless and comfortable as possible. We ask for prayers that we move through this time of transition with flexibility and grace. We look forward to seeing you all in our new space on Sunday mornings starting right after Christmas!

**Lighting Update**—We are working with the electrician to install parking lot, sign and steeple lights as soon as possible. Federal grant funds will pay for the parking lot fixtures.

**Pledge Payments**—Your continued pledge payments are vital to our efforts! We have budgeted for bridge loan financing. While we have not needed it yet, our cash balance is getting low and we will likely need to secure a bridge loan for the Sanctuary Restoration. As always, early pledge payments are welcome to minimize interest expenses.

January 5, 2020 Second Sunday after Christmas **Another Road** John 1:(1-9), 10-18

In the United Church of Christ, we often say that we take the Bible too seriously to read it literally. Once we have determined to take the Bible both seriously and not literally, how do we approach this sacred text? One way is through the practice of Lectio Divina, which is Latin for "divine reading." Lectio Divina, an ancient way of reading the Bible, was introduced by a gentle and loving theologian named Gregory of Nyssa (c. 330-395). Lectio Divina is not complicated. A scripture passage is read four times, and each time the experience of the passage is deepened. You can practice Lectio Divina on your own, with a prayer partner or in a small group. This week set aside twenty minutes to try Lectio Divina with the passage from today.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. John 1:1-4

**Prepare** Find a quiet place where you will be comfortable. You might want to light a candle, play some inspirational music, or spend a few minutes with a beautiful or sacred image. Invite God to join this reading with you, by praying a short prayer like "Meet me here, God."

**Lectio (Read)** You may want to read the passage aloud. On the first read, listen carefully for any words or phrases that jump out at you. What do you notice? What catches your attention? What surprises you?

**Meditatio (Reflect)** Read a second time. This time ask yourself if you can imagine being part of this story or passage. What does it look, sound, taste, smell, feel like to be part of this scripture? How does the passage remind you of themes, thoughts or feelings in your own life or in the world today?

**Oratio (Respond)** Read a third time. Ask, "From what I've heard and shared, what do I believe God wants me to do or be? How is God inviting me to change? From the lens of scripture, what transformation might be possible in my life?" You may want to record your thoughts in a journal.

**Contemplatio (Rest)** After the final reading, I spend a few moments in silent contemplation, to listen for the voice of the still-speaking God.
