he Missions Committee just ended, and I have to say how impressed I am. Part of the discussion centered around their budget being cut drastically, so much so that there is little to no money in their yearly budget to support the many organizations that we have been supporting financially for decades. Organizations within our local, state and national communities that do incredible work to spread the good news of Christ's love to all people. Each committee is having just these types of discussions as Council has had to make some difficult decisions to get us to a balanced budget.

Going in to each of the committees with a bit of trepidation, I was worried that each would focus on the negative impact of their particular ministry instead of the possibility of joining with all the other

committees and members to work together in tightening our belts and coming up with ways to have some fun with less money....a tall order.

And tonight, the Missions Committee spent much of their time brainstorming of ways to continue to do Mission work on behalf of the church with less. They spoke about drawing speakers to the church to educate us of issues and happenings going on around us that fit under the auspices of mission. They spoke about doubling down on an advocacy sub-committee so that our church might expend their voice in our community around issues of justice and fairness. They thought of ways to inspire the church to consider their decision and look to the future so that we might move toward a day when our support for worthy causes and organizations might be reinstated. They were invigorated, focused and upbeat.....despite having just lost so much of their budget.

As I have read the minutes, attended meetings and spoken to members, the response has been the same. Okay, what should we do now considering the current tight budget! I think we can raise more money than we have and then brainstorming ideas for the next 45 minutes. Each group has been a little

discouraged but then without exception, they put on their thinking caps and dug deep for some really great, creative ideas. From the Finance Committee to the Church Council, from CE to Missions, from Deacon's to Essex Eats Out, from the Food Pantry to the staff......everyone without exception is working to make our church continue to be strong, vibrant and healthy.

What is amazing are the ideas that are still being generated. Great work continues to be done with the Capital Campaign, but new ideas surface every week about ways to improve and make our building and grounds even better. Every committee and group, every discussion about the church, formal and informal has people sharing ideas and working together to try to get them to fruition.

Maya Angelou speaks about how that creativity as an innate gift from our God. God created the world and that creativity naturally manifests itself in every fiber of creation from the human body to animal adaptations to naturally correcting / healing ecosystems. There is nothing I love more than seeing your ideas pop during a brainstorming session and then following it up with months and sometimes years of organizational work as whatever the idea is embodied and placed into motion.

I know that some of you are a bit stressed by our financial worries. I am not. I am confident that God's creativity will guide us through. I have

faith in the God that is planted within your hearts and minds. I have faith in all of you and your dedication in making First Church a good place to be and to act in the name of the Divine for the sake of the world.

When I was in seminary, I dreamed **BIG.**

We're starting our second month in 2020. We just had our Annual Meeting where we elected new and returning members to lead our church council and our committees. We are in for a year of creativity, transformation, and restoration. Many of the new members of the committees have started attending their respective meetings committee already, ready to start their committee term on the ground running. We have started to digest proposed budget and approved it as proposed or as amended. It's easy to look at the state of the country and the state of religion in America and retreat into complacency and not dreaming big. We need to dream again, and we need to dream BIG. When we dream BIG, we pour our hearts into our idea and make it come alive. We need to imagine BIG. Dreaming big does require participation from nearly every

<u>Capital</u> <u>Campaign</u> <u>Update</u>

The Sanctuary Restoration Project is in full swing! The old plaster on the ceiling (and curved wall) has been removed. New plaster will be applied to the ceiling and then it must cure for several weeks. While the ceiling cures, the walls in the sanctuary, narthex and kitchen/choir loft stairwell will be patched. Once that is all done, painting can begin! Check out pictures of our progress on Facebook and our website.

Worship services will be held in Fellowship Hall while the sanctuary is closed for restoration (Sunday Dec. 29 through Palm Sunday). We look forward to worshipping with you in our new temporary space while construction is underway. Thank you for your patience and flexibility!

Let there be (energy-efficient) light! New LED parking lot light fixtures (and new LED lights for the signs and steeple) are finally IN! Federal security grant funds paid for the new parking lot fixtures. Campaign funds paid for new steeple and sign lights.

Federal Security Grant: We are moving forward with plans to add new interior door locks on classrooms and offices, as well as plans for a new controlled-access security system (including keyless locks on exterior doors). We are working to finalize contracts with vendors and get on their schedules.

Next Steps: The Campaign Steering Committee will meet at the end of January to finalize cost projections for our remaining projects and discuss priorities moving forward.

Pledge Payments...Your continued pledge payments are vital to our efforts! We have budgeted for bridge loan financing. While we have not

needed it yet, our cash balance is getting low and we will need to secure a bridge loan in order to complete the Sanctuary Restoration. As always, early pledge payments are welcome to minimize interest expenses.

"Your Good Deed Will be Much Appreciated"

What is Dismas House? Across Vermont there are four Dismas Houses that provide shelter and support for men and women who have served prison terms and are making the transition from life in prison to life outside.

For several years now, on the fourth Wednesday of each month, three folks who attend our Church have been preparing dinner for the residents and staff of the Dismas House in Winooski. One of us prepares an entrée, another a salad, and a third a dessert. The three of us usually stay to enjoy the meal with the Dismas House residents and staff. They are friendly and appreciative of our help. By participating in the program, we help to lessen the feelings of estrangement that burden folks who have served prison terms.

Want to volunteer? If you have never been to Dismas House and would like to volunteer, at least one person from the Church who has already been to Dismas House will be going there on the Wednesday you sign up for. There is a sign-up sheet that's on the bulletin board in the hall leading to the Church's social hall.

How many? Attending the meal are typically ten residents, two paid staff members (a Director and Associate Director who work there during weekdays), and the three of us from the Church who have prepared the food.
