Your Pastor's Ponderings

Dear Friends,

Let me assure all of you that First Congo Essex Junction will continue to be active in the lives of her members and the wider community as we live into Christ's demand to love each other and our neighbors. However, given the health and safety issues of the Corona outbreak, we will be doing church differently seeking both to keep our people safe by encouraging them to stay home AND remain a loving community of

faith given that we are not together in one place.

To keep our people safe, we will be asking all groups to honor the Vermont Department of Health's guidelines for group meetings and limit and or cease meeting in our space. This means that the following groups will either no longer be physically meeting until the authorities tell us it's safe to meet or for very small groups to practice safe distancing and cleaning measures. All groups, even smaller groups, are encouraged to continue meeting via Zoom or Facebook. The following groups are cancelling or limiting their time together

As you can see, our church has quite a few groups that meet and interact on a daily, weekly and monthly basis. Many of our church committees and interactive groups will continue to meet in various ways and our many ministries will remain active but in ways that allows for safety. The alternatives include

With so much face to face interactions being impossible, the church staff and volunteers will be reaching out to our members in different ways to check up on them but also to continue to maintain the strong bonds that unite us as a community of faith. So, the following actions will be occurring

- ❖ <u>Daily Devotionals</u>: every weekday morning at 8:00 a.m. and again every evening at 8:00 p.m. we will post a brief devotional with a scripture, thought for the day and prayers. Have a candle ready to light to set the stage at home. Rev. Mendes will start the day and Rev. Josh will end the day, but you will be able to access the messages any time during the day via Facebook: just click on the video post. https://www.facebook.com/firstcongregationalej/
- ❖ <u>Daily Lunch Break</u>: via Zoom every weekday at 12 noon. Have lunch with your church friends and just catch up with other church folks. No planned topics of discussion just whatever people want to talk about. https://zoom.us/j/954072355
- ★ <u>Deacons</u> will call every member and friend every ten days or so just to check in and see if there are any needs the church can help with
- ★ Resourcing Our Seniors: many of our members are older and or are in an "at risk" category of folks that are particularly susceptible to the corona virus so we encourage them to stay home and let younger members of the church get their groceries or pharmacy medications and drop them off at their front door. If you are older and need this assistance or are younger and can help with this assistance, please let us know at the church office [802 878-5745]. Or call Rev. Mark at 802 922-1773 or Rev. Josh at 920 858-6601.
- ★ Faith Formation/Youth: Laurie will be sending via electronic communication activities that parents can print out and use to help them with their faith development during the break as well as asking if they would like care packages sent to our kids every so often reminding them that they are remembered and loved by the church. Josh will similarly be reaching out to our youth.
- ★ Our Food Pantry will remain operational for the time being but the way we operate will be completely different, again to protect both volunteers and clients and to continue fulfilling Christ's call to feed those who are hungry. During this time of isolation and financial concern, we all feel as if this vital aspect of First Church's ministry should continue unabated. We strongly encourage our older Food Pantry volunteers to stay home and ask those of you not at risk who can fill their spots to let us know at the church office [802 878-5745]. For the next distribution, no clients will be allowed in the building, but we will be delivering food to their cars.
- ★ Zoom and Facebook Technology In this day when we are physically isolated we are all being challenged to stay connected with new ways of communicating and meeting. One way is through Facebook which is a social media group you can join that allows you to communicate with those you love with pictures, videos and simple typed messages. This is how many folks keep in touch with folks throughout the world. It is free to join. Zoom is another means to communicate where you become a member of Zoom, which allows you to join in a conversation live where folks are live and on camera. Each conversation has a numbered code to type in so that you get the right conversation. If you do not have a computer, you can also use a phone and give the Zoom

operator the same numbered code and then you will be a part of the conversation without the picture. Josh has typed up detailed instructions which will be in the newsletter and e-mail. If you need extra help, call Josh [920 858-6601] or Doug [802 878-5745 ext. 100] for assistance.

These are unsettling times, but the church will continue to reach out to all of you to offer spiritual solace, practical help and a sense of calm in the midst of the storm. We will do everything we can to keep our strong family of faith not only intact but stronger than ever. As we all spend more time at home, let us relish the time with our family, read more, reflect and pray more and get outside to walk more. Let us use this time to call your friends and or people from the church just to chat and see how they are doing.....maybe even to introduce yourself to someone from the church you do not know! Jesus' message of new life guides us to be hopeful and optimistic: to find positives in the midst of difficult times, to be calm in the midst of the storm, to be strengthened in the midst of weakening experiences and to proactive in spreading love. As followers of Jesus, let us never be defeated or discouraged but instead see this time as a way to strengthen our faith and build up the ties that bind us together.

Associate Pastor News

What a time to be alive!? It is exhausting, nerve-wracking, stressful, lonely, tiring time. Even though every day is the same, staying home, trying to avoid COVID-19, there is something new every day. The next month at least is going to be rough. Most experts don't think the virus will peak in the USA until early May. The next month we will see more cases, more severe ones, and more deaths. It is a hard fact. It is bone chillingly sad. We are allowed to grieve in this moment, grieving made harder since we cannot embrace most of our loved ones. There will be deaths of friends and family we cannot fully mourn with in-person funerals for months from now. If any happen here, we will find ways to grieve and to mourn and to celebrate their lives even if we cannot meet in-person together for some time for now. There will be friends and family members who are hospitalized and it will hurt even more because we will not be able to be by their side, to provide them some comfort as they try to fight off the virus. As a pastor, it is hard knowing that some who I minister to, I won't be able to visit in the hospital. Those of us, all of us, who are home socially distancing—so our doctors and nurses and all of the medical staff have a fighting chance to save as many lives by not overwhelming our hospitals—will find it more and more difficult to stay cooped up in our homes. And even if we know no one who becomes critically sick or dies, we will see the sickness and death on our TVs and our computers. All of this is going to happen, maybe not all of it to us, but it will in some way. I urge you during this time to give yourself a break. You might be teleworking from home, but if you need a break during the work day, do so. I urge you during this time to lift up prayers of lament. Let your tears flow. Let yourself feel the pain, for suppressing your emotions hurts and only prolongs your healing. When you need someone to talk with, call us, reach out to us. Join us for our virtual conversations and programs. We are in this together. For me, God is always in relationships. God is an experience. When two or three are gathered in God's name, God is present and holding us together. We don't need to be physically present to be present. God is with us and is holding us. God did not reign this virus down on us. God isn't a magician. God works within the reality of the universe which includes virus mutating and jumping from animals to humans. But Thomas Jay Oord says, God helps us squeeze the good out of the bad. I believe God is helping us as a community of faith squeeze some goodness out of this bad time in our world's history. I truly do. We are in this together. And when we are able as a community of faith to join together, we will mourn those who have died and we will celebrate getting through this moment in time.

Faith Formation is changing in our new virtual world. I am now sending out a weekly email with stories, conversation questions, activities and more that you can do with your children and youth on Sunday mornings or sometime during the week. Our world is changing around us and so we are adapting to how we can connect and ways to do this. We are turning to the Zoom online platform to meet virtually. I had been meeting with conference wide groups this way for a while now, when we couldn't meet face to face. I just had a meeting this morning chatting with other faith formation educators around our area in Vermont. We talked about ways we have started to do ministry anew, sharing these ideas with each other. I also have been watching how the west coast, who has been in this virtual ministry world longer than we have, and seeing how they are connecting and supporting their congregations. As we travel this new path of ministry I hope you will reach out and let me know you and your family are doing, pass along ideas and let me know what is not working. We are all so used to seeing people, giving hand shakes, hugs and high five's. Please help us navigate our Sundays with you and our weekly ministry programs. So much of our job has been changing and we'd love your feedback.



Pretzel Sunday will Sunday, March 29th in a virtual way. I will be sending out the pretzel recipe in my email and I'm asking Pastor Josh to add it to his weekly email as well. You get to decide when on Sunday you will make pretzels at your house. Maybe you would like to rise early and start your dough so that your pretzels will be baked and warm, ready during worship or right after we finish our 9:30am virtual worship service. Maybe your family would like to move right into the kitchen when worship finishes and

March is always the busiest time in my calendar, and COVID hasn't changed that; it's just changed the format. Easter approaches, and even though our hearts may not feel as sunny as in some other Aprils, it is to

Easter, and Alleluia, that time leads.

In our homes, we meet to worship, far away from sacred space. By the Spirit, Christ is with us, making this a holy place. In these days of social distance, we are called to meet apart. Our Home, Our Future, Our Time Capital Campaign Update

Even as the coronavirus has changed our church life in many ways, the Sanctuary Restoration Project is still underway and we are nearing the finish line. The scaffolding is GONE, and the plaster work is nearly complete and much of the sanctuary has been painted. Our painters continue to work on the trim in the sanctuary and will then move on to the pews.

Of course, so much is up in the air and out of our hands. We will make adjustments to our timelines in order to keep everyone safe and healthy. We will be back in our beloved sanctuary soon enough – and it is going to be beautiful.

Upcoming Campaign Projects: We continue to move forward with plans to add new interior door locks on classrooms and offices, as well as plans for a new controlled-access security systems (including keyless locks on exterior doors and new locks on all classroom/office doors). These improvements will be paid for with funds from our \$47,000 federal grant. The Church Street Entrance will also be updated with new, wider doors to accommodate the new security system and locks. Campaign funds will be used for that portion of the project. We anticipate that this work will take place in early June after we switch to one service.

Pledge Payments: Your continued pledge payments are vital to our efforts! We have budgeted for bridge loan financing. While we have not needed it yet, our cash balance is getting low and we will need to secure a bridge loan in order to complete the Sanctuary Restoration. As always, early pledge payments are welcome to minimize interest expenses.

- 2. The last three digits of the card to be reloaded. Note: this must be a card that you've purchased from the church. If you're reloading a card not purchased directly from the church, we need the full card number.
- 3. The amount of money to be loaded onto the card.
