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Your Pastor's Ponderings

Dear Friends, First Church has never been busier; worship, meetings, pastoral care, music, youth group, social encounters, physical plant improvements and community outreach opportunities continue to occur despite the COVID -19 pandemic. Instead of doing all these aspects of ministry face to face, we are Zooming, YouTubing, Facebooking, Pastoral Walking and Safe Distancing Food Distributing.

The coronavirus has caused our church to conduct ministry in very different ways and despite missing the face to face interactions, there are ways in which our church is becoming ever more vibrant and healthier. Worship via live streaming is attracting double the number of people to worship. With few people physically present at church, the projects from our Capital Campaign are occurring without any programmatic or staff hindrances. The sanctuary plastering and painting is complete, the carpets have been cleaned, the pulpit and lectern are becoming moveable to allow for greater flexibility in the sanctuary and now all the staff is working from home to allow the administrative wing to have its asbestos removed / floors completely re-surfaced and in two weeks all the locks will be replaced to increase the safety throughout the church. We now have morning and evening devotionals and our Deacons are checking in on more members now than ever. We have a large Confirmation Class preparing to graduate on May 31st [you will not want to miss that service!] Our choirs continue to produce a high-quality product for our enjoyment. And the donations and clients are significantly up in our Heavenly Food Pantry outreach. All those ministries are being accomplished in the midst of the worst health care and economic crises in a hundred years. And on top of it all, all of you continue to get your pledges in! Such success is a tribute to our staff, leadership, volunteers and members and I am deeply grateful for what all of you do to make that happen.

However, despite these successes, it is still frustrating and disappointing to say that we are in this for the long haul. Re-entry back into the rhythms and cycles of our past church life will not take place for quite a while: months at the least, maybe a year or more! The Vermont Department of Health, our Governor, and our scientific experts all expect a vaccine to take a year to create and then even longer to mass produce. Your church leaders and staff are erring on the side of keeping all of you safe and healthy. As one small example, the suggested safe distancing between people is six feet but when singing that distance gets expanded to twenty-five feet! How do we worship without singing? Or perhaps a better question would be, how can we worship without singing and still celebrate and enjoy music?

It looks like the experts have understood the process to be tiered, or we will re-enter in similar ways to how we moved into our current "stay at home" order: in bits and stages. Perhaps some staff can return to the building first. Then small church and or community groups would be able to return to using our building given that they use all the safety protocols. Then if there is not a noticeable increase in cases, that number might be increased over time. For example, right now the Thrift Shop is discussing how to abide by Gov. Scotts new recommendations as they contemplate opening. Church Leadership and Staff have determined to abide by the following simple guidelines for all church and outside group activities to help us move toward re-entry in a safe, yet cautious way.

- We will strive to follow the guidelines and directives from:
 - The Vermont Department of Health
 - Governor Phil Scott's Office
 - The Center for Disease Control
 - The Scientific and Medical Experts
- Council's Executive Committee (EC) will monitor / update these policies EC consists of President, VP, Treasurer, Clerk, Chair of Deacons, Clergy
- ♦ Volunteers over 65 or at risk can volunteer in groups of no more than two

We are learning as we journey through these uncertain days and the situation changes each week; this seems to be the nature of these pandemic times. So, I would ask everyone to live into God's grace a bit and realize we are all trying to do the right thing and keep everyone safe. We know these days will cease and we will return to a church life where gatherings, hugs, dinners, and handshakes are the norm. Then we will joyously celebrate our upgraded facilities but more importantly our love and care for each other. Stay safe and if you have any needs, please call the church office or forward your needs to one of our staff members. Let us remain strong, hopeful and compassionate as we seek to continue building Christ's community of love and peace. As always, I am

The Capital Campaign work in the sanctuary is finally complete and it looks so beautiful! We are eagerly awaiting the day when we can all worship there together again. The carpets AND pew cushions have been cleaned –Apex Carpet & Upholstery really did a terrific job.

Wing of the building to remove old asbestos tile in all the offices and hallways on the lower levels. Originally, we thought we might need to wait a while before starting this project due to COVID-19. However, our Finance Committee and Council gave us the green light to move forward. Doing the flooring now will be the least disruptive to our operations, because the offices are pretty much empty anyhow. AND it will allow us to move forward with updating the Church Street Entrance with new, wider doors and our new keyless entry/security system. We also hope to have the new interior door locks installed on classrooms and offices in early June. The security improvements will be paid for with funds from our \$47,000 federal grant.

For the capital campaign, your continued pledge payments and even early pledge payments will help us avoid the need to access the bridge loan and help minimize (or even eliminate) interest expenses. Plans for Moveable Pulpit & Lectern

The goal is to make our worship space more flexible AND make our space more attractive to people who might rent our sanctuary, while at the same time preserving the beauty of the existing pulpit and lectern AND maintaining the current layout. Andy Blodgett, who made the custom cabinetry in Fellowship Hall, is in the process of making the necessary modifications to the pulpit and lectern. These changes will be made possible through the Memorial Fund.

Per Capita Gifts Requested / Mother's Day Gift

Our church, the First Congregational Church of Essex Junction belongs to the Champlain Association of the Vermont Conference of the United Church of Christ. The local, state and national entities of our denomination are united in covenant with shared historical and theological roots that tie us together in to one big, diverse and unique whole. Many churches and denominations have split up over the years, but we strive ourselves as being a denomination that draws diverse people and groups together. Our very name attests to our founding in 1957, where four completely different denominations came together to form the United Church of Christ. We each play our role and we each support one another in our particular calling in following Christ. In good congregational fashion, no bishop or more centralized committee demands that we pay our dues, but instead we freely give money as a local congregation as part of our covenantal relationship with the association, state and national instrumentalities. We have pledged as a church to offer \$ 14 per member to maintain this unique experiment of church organization. Normally we take this collection during our Mother's Day worship service, but we have missed that this year, so I encourage everyone to send in your per capita covenantal amount for each member in your family [\$ 14 per member]. If you can chip in an extra dollar or two, then it should cover those members who cannot afford this extra financial burden. And we traditionally do it on Mother's Day because the church is often referred to as our mother [mother church].

Jamaica Service Program Update

The Jamaica leadership team has made the difficult decision to push the next Jamaica trip to 2022 due to the uncertainty surrounding travel in this time of COVID 19. We will be looking at ways to support our Jamaican partners and perhaps local Jamaican agricultural workers in 2020 and 2021.We are excited to announce that the communications committee will be launching a Jamaica section on the FCCEJ website in the near future. We invite you to check it out! This fall, we will begin recruiting members for the 2022 team. You will find lots of information on the website. The school is closed, and children are learning remotely. The Resort and many businesses are closed to prevent an outbreak there. They are thinking of us and wishing us well!

<u>Safely receiving food:</u> Due to current health directives, the shopping process will be modified, and food will be delivered to vehicles in the Church parking lot. Clients will stay in their vehicles, where a

volunteer will gather family information and bagged food will be placed in car trunks. This way, exposure will be strictly limited for both clients and volunteers.

<u>Donations</u>: The Pantry's most needed items are baked beans, tomato soup, chicken noodle soup, corn, peas. The pantry has plenty of dish soap. For the last couple of weeks in May, the church's administrative wing is undergoing construction. The blue tote immediately outside of our Church Street entrance will be accessible to those delivering donations.
