#### Our Home, Our Future, Our Time Capital Campaign Update

<u>Project News</u>: The old asbestos tile flooring in the administrative wing hallways and offices was removed and replaced. We are in the process of painting the hallways to give the whole area a much-needed facelift (volunteers needed - let us know if you would like to help!). The small bathrooms on the lower level have new flooring, but the rest of the remodel will happen later in the summer or when we have a little more volunteer-power. The new Church Street entrance doors have been ordered and will be installed in the coming weeks, along with the new grant-funded security system. Interior classroom/office locks have already been replaced to allow the doors to be locked from the inside (another grant-funded project). Slowly but surely, we are making tremendous progress on our long list of campaign projects! "Our Home" will be beautiful, ready & waiting for everyone's safe return.

<u>Pledge Payments</u>: In these challenging times, we know that many folks are dealing with financial uncertainty and hardship and taking care of yourself and your family is the top priority. For the capital campaign, early pledge payments will help us avoid the need to access the bridge loan and help minimize (or even eliminate) interest expenses. #### **Heavenly Food Pantry**

We continue to operate monthly on the  $2^{nd}$  Monday ~ 5:30-7:30pm and  $4^{th}$  Thursday ~ 2-6pm. Next Pantry date is **Thursday**, **June 25<sup>th</sup>**.

- On Saturday, June 20th, we need volunteers to prepare grocery bags at 10 am (any age below 65).
- On Thursday, June 25th: we need volunteers from 10-12 pm (any age below 65); and 1:30-4 pm and 4-6 pm (16 years old + and under 65). From 2-4 pm, we pre-bag veggies and fruit, and from 5:30 to 7:30 pm, we distribute the food. If you are high risk or sick, please stay home.

<u>Safety Precautions</u>: Residents of Essex, Essex Junction and Westford are welcome to enter the parking lot at First Congregational Church of Essex Junction using the Church Street entrance. Vehicles will be ushered to a pickup spot after showing proof of residence and identification for each family member, including children. Food will be delivered to the vehicle's trunk, thereby ensuring a safe contactless delivery. There are no income requirements to participate, but additional food from the USDA is available to those who verify their income falls below federally mandated guidelines. Everyone will leave with at least 60 pounds of food! Those needing food but unable to attend can call Pastor Josh at 878-5745 to make other arrangements. We all need help now and then—The pantry is here for you! *Please be respectful and use a face covering when visiting*.

<u>Donations</u>: The Pantry's most needed items are toothpaste, peanut butter, jelly/jams, baked beans, chicken noodle soup, corn, and peas. The blue tote immediately outside of our Church Street entrance will be accessible to those delivering donations anytime of day or night. Donations can be placed within a large filing cabinet inside our Church Street entrance's foyer Monday-Friday, 8am-2pm; or in the basket within our vestibule at the Parking Lot entrance at those same times.

To protect residents of Dismas House, as well as ourselves, from acquiring the coronavirus, one of us simply collects the food and drops it off at Dismas House without entering the house.
