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Your Pastor's Ponderings

Dear Friends: Despite wanting so very much to physically worship

Due to the unprecedented nature of COVID19, this issue of SPIRIT@FIRST was purposefully delayed while church officers & staff carefully deliberated on many important aspects of our ministry. We appreciate your patience and hope that you enjoy the read!

together, the Executive Committee of the Church Council has postponed the date when we will gather back together in the sanctuary. We are now hoping to be in the sanctuary for Advent, which starts on November 29th. How joyful it would be to enter the church with the Christmas decorations up and our building looking so good! Naturally, the Executive Committee (EC) will meet in early November to look at what the scientists, doctors and the Vermont Department of Health say and then re-evaluate the situation at that time. Despite our strong desire to be together, our primary consideration is the health and welfare of our members and friends and the control of this deadly disease. As all of you in your daily lives know, we are adapting and changing our plans as the future unfolds and we will do the best we can in making decisions in the best interests of First Church. We are also cautiously opening up our church space to various groups within our church and community as long as everyone present follows safe practices by wearing masks and keeping proper distances. Last week we had a funeral service with 37 people attending: all wearing masks, all following safe distancing protocols and with the fellowship time outside. The Food Pantry continues to distribute food but does so while all their clients stay in their cars. Creative Discoveries Early Care and Education Center is meeting in their space and not venturing into our part of the building. The scouts have been meeting but mainly outside except for a few very small groups. We also had a wonderful Nearly New Sale, Thrift Store Porch Sale, and Church Tour day on August 22, but these events were outside, and tours were tightly controlled. The EC just approved one other group and one personal event to take place in our midst. Slowly, our facility is opening up to small groups - with safety for our members and visitors forefront in our intentions.

Perhaps the biggest addition to our building use is the Rec Kids Supported Learning Spaces Program that the Essex Junction Recreation and Parks Department, in partnership with the school system, is providing for families in the Essex community. This valuable program will provide childcare for families who need care for their children on days that they are not in school. Summit Street students will be using our third-floor rooms, gym, restrooms and outside green space for this well-received and appreciated program. EJRP will clean the space each day and the number of kids will be limited to how many can safely meet. For the church to participate in such a program and meet the community's needs is a great opportunity and it's a wonderful testament for our church to be thought of as a possible site. All of us will need to adjust what we do to make this vital initiative work but we can do it!

Unfortunately, many of our groups are larger than can safely meet right now, and many of the ways we interact with each other are conducive to the spread of the disease: we talk, eat, hug, sing, and meet in small rooms for hours. But the staff and lay leaders are looking for ways to draw people together. Josh and Laurie have been taking the youth groups on hikes, Josh and I have provided pastoral walks and visits in chairs under trees, Laurie and CE will be having on site Faith Formation once a month outside, Carol and the choir are looking at parking lot choir rehearsals, hospitality is thinking about having coffee and cocoa outside on Sunday mornings for those who attend 'drive-in' church services in the parking lot, and Josh sits and has lunch with a small group

of folks on Mondays. In many ways we are busier and providing more support to our community than we were pre-COVID! We are all working to keep the church vibrant, active and our people connected to each other.

If you have questions, concerns, ideas, or insights, please pass them along to one of our staff members or lay leaders. If you are feeling particularly isolated, let us know so that we can use the church's many resources to support you. Together, our church has been strengthened through this time of stress and together we will remain an ever growing and vibrant member of the Essex community. Thank you all for shouldering the weight of change and continuing to make First Church a great community in which to belong.

We, as your Executive Committee, will do our best to continue to keep you informed.

Associate Pastor News

The leaves will start to turn golden yellow, bright red, brilliant orange dazzling us with the reminder that we live in a place with seasons. The transition from one season to the next teaches us how to transition gracefully from one season of our lives to the next. Tree leaves are green because they are filled with chlorophyll. When the seasons start to change, the chlorophyll is removed from the leaves, and "as this pigment is pumped out of the leaves, the yellow and brown colors that were there all along predominate." The yellow and brown colors that were there all along are revealed. The changing of the season reveals to us what was there all along. I have found this to be similar to humans, as well. When we undergo a transition, either forced or chosen, it reveals to us the strengths and resiliency already contained within us. Theologically, God's presence adds to the strength within us and strengthens our resolve to meet the challenges ahead of us. The Psalmist writes over and over that God's presence is a Helper to them. The Psalmist in 118: 6-8: "Because God is with me, I'm not afraid—what can anyone do to me? Because God is with me as my Helper, I can triumph over my enemies. Better to take refuge in God than to trust in human beings." Scripture echoes God's presence in our lives, giving us strength, and helping us to draw energy we need to sustain us through the transitions in life. 2020 so far has been filled with many challenges and its highly likely more challenges will come. Let us draw upon the strength that is within us and to reach out to God's presence that is always with us, adding to our strength, as a Helper.

One of the Benedictions found in the United Church of Christ's Book of Worship offers this:

Go forth into the world to serve God with gladness; be of good courage; hold fast to that which is good; render to no one evil for evil; strengthen the fainthearted; support the weak; help the afflicted; honor all people; love and serve God, rejoicing in the power of the Holy Spirit. The grace of Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. Amen

Our Fall Faith Formation programs are looking different this year, like many things are in our new world with COVID-19. As I write this we are just one week away from schools starting and many of you are nervous and anxious about how things will go. So many decisions have gone into opening up our schools and keeping our children and youth safe. Same is happening here at church, we too have been figuring out how we can do faith formation and our programs for children and youth safely this fall. I have also been taking part in some online webnars around faith formation today.

Pastor Mark, Pastor Josh and myself have continued to meet and have been working on creating our own curriculum that keeps our children and youth connected to the topics talked about in worship. We will start this new program on September 13th, when worship will change to 10am, with our new 'Faith Formation Outside' in our parking lot from 9am to 9:30am on the 2nd Sunday of the month. Pastor Mark & Pastor Josh can join us at this time and most of you should be able to travel back home to watch worship online or stay here in the parking lot and listen to it on the radio. We will practice social distancing, wear our masks and have fun with a sidewalk chalk course, a children's message and handing out bibles to our 3rd graders. On the other Sundays of the month I hope you will join me on Zoom at 9am for a short half hour (at the most) of Faith @ home with Laurie. All ages of children and youth are invited. If you'd like to think of it as having 'breakfast with Laurie' please do. We will build community, answer any questions you have and help you with your Faith @ Home items that you collected on the 2nd Sunday of the month in the parking lot (your monthly package). If we miss you on the 2nd Sunday, your items will be delivered to you. We look forward to seeing you on the 2nd Sunday of October when the pastors will be blessing the animals, so bring your pet with you that morning. In November, we'll have communion in the parking lot and in December we will have an Advent celebration.

We are working on transitioning our VB Camp webpages into faith formation pages with videos and resources that you can access at your convenience 24/7 to help you grow in your faith. More to come on this.

Please if you have thoughts or would like to help with our children and youth ministry programs this year I hope you will reach out. I'd love to chat more with you about this, take a social distant walk or sit outside wearing our masks.

Communications

The transformation of the website has continued since our last update, and our "renovation" of the site is now complete. Two new main menu items have been added: "Worship & Music" and "Calendar & News". The Worship & Music area features information about the different worship opportunities offered at FCCEJ and the different music groups. The Deacons will be evaluating options to extend this area with more information and ways to engage our Faith Community. The Calendar & News area is focused on timely information on events as well as an overview of annual traditions at FCCEJ.

The Grow in Faith area of our website saw some extra traffic this summer because it was the access point for Vacation Bible Camp @Home the week of August 10th. Several amazing volunteers created videos for various components of camp, and this was all pulled together for easy and secure access on our website by campers and their families. Lessons learned will help design future enhancements for the Grow in Faith area.

Our next areas of focus are evaluating options to update the Calendar on the website and further utilization of SignUp Genius. We want to make it simpler for members of our church family to know about upcoming events and sign up to assist in many ways.

<u>Trustees</u>

In addition to all the Campaign Projects in the administrative wing, the Trustees continue to take care of our buildings and grounds. We recently replaced the aging furnace in the Sawyer House and cleaned out the barn, hauling away tons of trash, wood and broken items that had accumulated over many years. The Boy Scouts also took part in the barn clean-out, which was a huge help! We are also looking into ways to add some soundproofing insulation in the daycare wing of the building. Outside, we have a new picnic table on the church street side, and our lawn care investments look like they are paying off.

The other big item we are working on is the elevator. We also recently completed some major repairs to our elevator, and we passed our state inspection. That said, our elevator is 40 years old, and both the state inspector and our elevator maintenance company (currently Bay State Elevator) have said that the elevator needs to be modernized. They have recommended modernization over replacement. It is a very large expense, estimated to be \$70K plus the cost of some electrical upgrades. This is not something that needs to happen immediately, and the elevator is safe to operate. The Trustees are evaluating our options and beginning to think about how we might pay for this unexpected capital expense. We will have more information in the coming months and will certainly keep everyone posted.

In October 2019, FCCEJ received a \$47,000 grant from the Vermont Department of Homeland Security to improve the security and safety of our church. The grant provided funding for new exterior lighting, new locks on all classrooms and offices, new exterior doors for the Church Street Entrance, and a new controlled access/keyless entry system.



Missions

Heavenly Food Pantry continues to operate monthly on the 2^{nd} *Monday* ~ 5:30-7:30pm [September 14^{th}] and 4^{th} *Thursday* ~ 2-6pm [September 24^{th}]. *Questions or Concerns?* Please, email welcome@fccej.org or call the church at 1 (802) 878-5745 ext. 100.

<u>Safely receiving food:</u> Due to current health directives, the shopping process will be modified, and food will be delivered to vehicles in the Church parking lot. Clients will stay in their vehicles, where a volunteer will gather family information and bagged food will be placed in car trunks. This way, exposure will be strictly limited for both clients and volunteers.

<u>Donations</u>: The Pantry's most needed items are canned green beans, canned corn, liquid dish soap, shampoo, deodorant, and jams/jellies. For the last couple of weeks in May, the church's administrative wing is undergoing construction. The blue tote immediately outside of our Church Street entrance will be accessible to those delivering donations.

Heavenly Cents Thrift Shop is located at 37 Main Street, Essex Junction, VT, obtusely adjacent to our church! They are open on Tuesdays, 10am-1pm; Wednesdays, 4-8pm; and Saturdays, 10am-1pm.

<u>Volunteer!</u> Because over 65-year-olds aren't allowed to work at the shop, we are unable to open as much as we'd like and the hours we are open (7 hrs. a week) are staffed by the small number of volunteers who are under 65. Are you under 65 and are available to help on a Tuesday 10-1? Working at the shop is fun! You will be assisting customers, neatening the shop and displaying merchandise. Masks are required and the number of shoppers in the shop is limited to 3. Please contact Elaine if you're interested: **ebraymond@gmail.com**

Jamaica Service Program Update

In June, the Jamaica Leadership team made the difficult decision to postpone our next service trip, scheduled for 2021. We are now hoping to be able to go in 2022. Although we will not be traveling to Jamaica in the near future, we wanted to be able to continue to support our Jamaican partners and in particular, the White Horses School Community in St. Thomas, in this difficult time.

As of August 17, Jamaica has had 1192 documented cases of COVID19. There have been 89 cases in St. Thomas in the past 3 weeks. The Ministry of Health and Wellness is now conducting home visits to do increased testing. Three specific areas within St. Thomas are under quarantine. Children in these areas are students at White Horses School.

We reached out to principal Ray Howell to find out how the school is doing and to ask him about their most pressing needs. At this time, they are still hoping to begin school on September 7th, using a hybrid model in which students will rotate in-person/remote days to allow for social distancing. Many students do not have access to internet or devices, but most parents have cell phones. For this reason, remote instruction is given using WhatsApp, a free communication platform and is often done in the evening, when parents who are working are more likely to be home (so the phone is available). Principal Howell indicated that there are two urgent needs.

- Scholarships. The first is financial assistance for families in need. Jamaican students are required to pay for uniforms and books. In addition, the children need to have shoes. This is a challenge for many families, especially those who have lost jobs due to COVID19. We will provide full scholarships for 10 students.
- Perimeter fencing. The second urgent need is for fencing to enclose the perimeter of the school grounds. The Ministry of Education has made this a requirement for the safety and security of the children but has not provided funding. White Horses has been working for over a year to raise money and has built most

of the required wall. This barrier has become more urgent as they need all people who approach the school grounds to enter through the main entrance where they will be conducting health checks to screen for COVID19. We have agreed to provide funding for them to erect a fence to complete this project. (In fact, the garden fence we built in 2017 has also served to provide double duty as partial perimeter fencing).

We're very excited to be able to continue to support this school during this difficult time. Mr. Howell is so grateful, on behalf of the school community, for our care and interest and ongoing support. Finally, he reported (and sent photos showing) that the playground we built in 2019 is in great shape!

Crop Walk Launches September 2020

This fall it will be our pleasure to host a multigenerational walk to support the World Church Services faith-based response to local, regional, and global hunger, poverty, displacement, and disaster. Please watch for the September live launch for details and plan to join us on Sunday, October 18, at 11: 20 am for a physically distant walk up and down Main St (pandemic conditions pending) to support this great cause.
