Due to not being in church when we collected the Per Capita collection, we are also way behind in that particular offering, an offering where we pay \$ 14.50 for every member of the church to the Vermont Conference of the UCC. Ideally, everyone chips in their share but that did not happen this year so again, I am offering you the opportunity to partner with the wider church in helping us meet that obligation.
