Your Pastor's Ponderings......

Making Connections, Nurturing Hope Renewing Divine Connections

The overarching theme for this year is, "Making Connections, Nurturing Hope" and our worship planning gathering last August thought it would lead us away from the isolation and discouragement of the pandemic to a healthier way of living. This yearly theme was fine-tuned for our Lenten Journey in 2023 with the second phrase above: "Renewing Divine Connections" for Lent is a time when we look for ways to deepen our understanding of and relationship to our God. Oftentimes, due to the depth of thought the passion and death of Jesus portends, we dig deeper and think a bit existentially about life, our priorities, the importance of certain relationships, our own behaviors especially those that keep us from being whom God has called us to be and the powers and principalities of the world and how they in turn affect us. Early followers of Christ had these questions brought to their attention by the master teacher of all time. As the church brought in new members, they in turn were asked to ponder these things during Lent as they prepared to make their public commitment to Christ on Easter morning.

Today in our congregation, we encourage folks to spend a little more time reflecting on life and faith as we journey from Ash Wednesday to a somber and quiet Holy Saturday when the whole world waits for the deathly silence to be broken. We provide special services to begin the Lenten Journey, as well as during Holy Week when Maundy Thursday and Good Friday become avenues for understanding Christ's radical message of love. We will also have a prayer vigil for the 40 hours from Christ's death to the moment of sunrise on Easter day; everyone is encouraged to sign up for one of those hours and be in church alone to pray, read or just sit with God. But we are also planning a Shrove [PHAT] Tuesday Pancake Dinner on Tuesday Feb. 21st from 5 to 7pm. The Palm Sunday Cantata on April 2nd is coming back this year as our new Organist / Choir Director Bethany Blake brings back "The Robe." And the Wednesday Night Searchers will be watching the fantastic new widely acclaimed series on Jesus' life entitled "The Chosen" every Wednesday during Lent. If you would like to host a "Chosen" watch group in your home, let Rev. Mark know.

All of these special activities are designed to get you to think more deeply about your relationship to God. In addition, some folks work the discipline of fasting into their weekly schedule while other folks give up particular items or aspects of their lives deemed unworthy in the presence of Christ's sacrificial love for us [alcohol, sugar, meat, restaurants, etc]. Others, tired of oppressive and dire religion, take on positive habits or behaviors in order to nurture the goodness in their hearts planted there by the spirit of the Living God [letters, vegetables and fruits, exercise, reading a gospel or book on spirituality, making peace with those with whom you have issues, prayer or meditation, etc].

As we approach Lent, let us harken back to a day and age when we took time to take stock of our lives, our faith in God, and our understanding of the most important figure in human history: Jesus Christ. Thrilled to be walking this enlightened path with all of you, I am

WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 22

~Ash Wednesday Service, 7pm in the Sanctuary~

Easter was the first celebration of the church and rightly so! Folks remembered and highlighted that significant event from the beginning of the church. An entire liturgical season [Easter] grew out of that occasion as it became the Sunday when new members joined through the sacrament of baptism at the break of dawn when the sun was rising. The Second church season grew out of the Easter Celebration and became a time to reflect and prepare for becoming a member as well as the grand celebration. The second season was Lent and continues to be a key time when we reflect on the meaning of our Christian faith and the importance of Christ's passion and death to our faith. One scholar stated that it is impossible to grasp the true meaning of Easter unless you travel down the darkened, narrowed streets of Lent. Our Ash Wednesday Service will be on Wednesday, February 22, 2023 at 7pm. The Ashes either placed on your forehead or wrists remind us of our connections to Christ's suffering as well as the finitude of our mortal life and thus our total dependance on God/ Jesus for our eternal hope. Everyone is welcome.

Lent: Renewing Divine Connections

Please feel free to pray for the folks on the list as part of your Lenten journey. By Easter morning, everyone at FCCEJ will have been lifted up in prayer.

Laurie's Lens

Lent is upon us. Ash Wednesday arrives on February 22nd and our Epiphany time will be over for another year. We've heard the story again of Jesus being baptized by his cousin John. Then came Jesus calling his first disciples, fishermen, to join him and learn how to fish for people. There is a story between these two and that is Jesus going into the dessert for 40 days, being tempted by evil, and then his ministry starts. This is way the season of Lent is 40 days long, not counting Sundays. Lent is followed by the period of 50 days of Eastertide, or the season of Easter, ending on Pentecost Sunday. Easter moves around each year due to its date being determined by the first Sunday, after the first full moon, following the first day of Spring or the March equinox. Therefore, the date of Easter can be anywhere between March 22 and April 25th (this year is April 9th). Once you determine the day of Easter, you then count backwards on the calendar 40 days, not counting Sundays, to arrive on Ash Wednesday.

I have found the season of Lent much more meaningful when I take on something new or add a forgotten task back into my life, much more so than giving something up. When I think of Jesus' time on earth and all the stories of his life with the disciples, he took on a lot and his burdens were many. This Lent I plan to write notes, send cards and be more intentional about connecting with people in my life. I hope you too will find a way to spread the love of Christ to others, be an active disciple, reach out to those in need, volunteer where and when you can, watch for the love of God in people and be open to the Spirit moving...however and wherever it chooses. Try reaching beyond your comfort zone. I think the first disciples probably did this as well. They willingly left their job of fishing, their family and followed Jesus traveling around the area, learning and growing in their faith and supporting each other.

As you look ahead and plan your summertime and where you will spend it, I hope you will take advantage of the offerings that we have for your child, youth or yourself to continue to grow in your faith.

We all know that attending church, faith formation and youth time can help you gather and build your faith foundation and relationship with God, but it's just one hour a week or three if you are old enough for youth time. That's just 52 hours per year, if you attend every week, and another 36-48 for the youth. When you think how many hours there are in a year, this isn't much. Do we take advantage of how often we can attend and grow? Summer camps can add on more. Vacation Bible Camp (15 to 35 hours) or a UCC summer week away (around 80 hours), or one of our FCCEJ camping weekends where fellowship with other believers is fun and rewarding. A strong foundation of faith is what we all are striving for. It is what we lean on when the low times in our lives arrive, and we can't predict when they come so it's even more important to keep our foundations strong.

Here's to staying more connected to our God and each other as we walk along this journey of life with our families, our church friends which in turn keeps our ministries at FCCEJ vibrant and alive.

The most noticeable tech update for those viewing the service via YouTube would be the addition of two new high definition cameras. The resolution on the new cameras is very good and with two cameras the transition from Pulpit to Lectern is smooth.



Some really cool new tech that is less noticeable, but makes the live stream go smoother, is the addition of a joystick controller for the new cameras. The joystick controller lets the livestream team operate the cameras in a way that makes for a more pleasant viewing experience.



Last but not least, those of you who enjoy using the hearing assist headsets during in-person worship have probably already noticed that there are more headsets to go around!
