Meditative / Listening Prayer

During this time of prayer, we will focus on simply sitting in silence with our God and listening for God's voice or guidance in our lives. Begin with sitting comfortably, claiming peace in your space, and then breathing deeply: quiet your soul. This type of prayer encourages triaging the thoughts in your mind by acknowledging and letting go of the thoughts that distract you and focusing on the ones that draw you to the Divine. This naturally takes time to figure out, but you'll become proficient quicker than you think.

Incorporating this prayer practice into your life is perhaps the most effective way of re-connecting with God, for few of us practice intentional quiet and listening.

Practicing Meditative Prayer Corporately

During this part of the pastoral prayer, let's practice meditative or listening prayer in our corporate lives. Let us continue in silence as we listen for a minute or two focusing our thoughts on our church and where God is leading us. Rev. Mark will then ask folks to share those thoughts with the congregation. Then we will sing.....
