During the last week of March, we completed the final project [Fellowship Hall Floor] of the *Our Home, Our Future and Our Time* Capital Campaign. We kicked off the campaign with initial pledges of \$650,000 out of our stated goal of \$822,000. Our church had never raised such an amount and no one was sure we could do it, so we added a number of projects as a stretch goal which then totaled \$1.09 million and to everyone's delighted surprise we ended up raising \$1,148,809! Almost every room, surface, and floor in our facility has been upgraded and our church facility is in the best shape it's been in over 60 years! We will celebrate this great accomplishment in worship at both services. You will not want to miss this **PARTY!**
