<u>Congregation</u>: We looked at all the materials presented, we listened to our leaders and then we voted to move forward with the Our Home, Our Future, Our Time Capital Campaign.

<u>Kaki McGeary</u>: Dave Johnson and I became Co-Chairs of an august body of members who raised over \$1,100,000 to accomplish projects the entire church voted in order to make our building an able assistant to our ministry.

<u>Dave Johnson</u>: Kaki McGeary and I, plus the entire Capital Campaign Committee, worked with the Trustees to oversee the congregation's project list and ensure that they were accomplished to our specifications and liking.

<u>Capital Campaign Committee</u>: We participated in the feasibility study, we worked with the congregation to develop the project list, we worked with contractors and businesses, we pledged our gifts early, and we made decisions to ensure the success of the campaign.

<u>Pledgers</u>: After the presentations, we gave our funds to the campaign. When the elevator needed work, some of us pledged for an extra year. We gave freely so that Christ's work in this sacred building might continue.

<u>Everyone</u>: We are thrilled to have been a part of this successful project. We celebrate our refurbished building and its use in Christ's work. We lift up the faith it took to step into such an endeavor. Thank you, God, for offering us the opportunity for a brighter future.

<u>President Catherine Shearer</u>: We should all be proud of what we have accomplished here. Come, let us thank the key leaders who contributed so much of their time and energy to guarantee its success.
