Your Pastor's Ponderings......

We are in the heart of celebrating Christ's empty tomb with familiar stories of Jesus walking, talking, breaking bread, eating, forgiving, and teaching his disciples and the wider community. Christ's resurrection promises new life and hope, much needed outlooks in today's culture. While we claim these great gifts of the faith, our neighbors remember Passover and cherish breaking Ramadan's fast or simply relish the chocolate bunnies, Easter egg hunts, mountaintop hikes or festive meals where families and friends gather to lift life up as a gift. Whether mirroring the excitement of the resurrection, or claiming their own path toward optimism, it is a joy to see most everyone emerge from their winter doldrums by embodying the highest of human ideals. Many of us see the guiding hand of God in drawing everyone together in such a public and positive way. Our Easter was filled with supernal music, delicious food, spirit filled worship and enough people to feel like the old pre-pandemic days of abundance.

What is usually a low turn-out week turned into quite a celebration as we lifted up the tremendous success of *Our Home, Our Future, Our Time* Capital Campaign. Our church raised \$1.15 million dollars to upgrade every corner of our building from the sanctuary to the parking lot, from the administrative wing to the kitchen, from every window and floor to the bathrooms, from the elevator to our entrances. We praised the leadership of Kaki McGeary and Dave Johnson along with the Capital Campaign Committee and the Trustees who shepherded all the projects, money and details of the many projects voted upon by the congregation. Then we ate cake!!! All the generous gifts and the accompanying work highlighted the hope of the future that the theological truth of the resurrection purported to plant within the faithful.

After such pinnacles of experience, I was ready to rest a bit and catch up on my visiting and administrative paperwork. Alas, Christ's resurrection spirit never ends, but instead continues to invite our community into a brighter future. The energy and creativity of spirit seems invigorated in this place, even after the Easter celebration, even after the close of the capital campaign!

- The Jamaican Service Trip Team is planning to alternate between domestic and international service trips starting next summer with a Blackfeet Native American service trip to Montana where adults, families and older youth will be invited.
- Our Bridge Club had three tables this past month and are expanding their card playing to meet on the first and third Friday of every month from 1:30 4pm.
- We have been invited to participate in the first City of Essex Junction Pride Event on June 3rd at the Maple Street Park by providing a kid family gaming station.
- For the first time in many years, we have our Planned Giving Committee partnering with a local lawyer in offering an educational workshop on wills, trusts and other instruments to ensure our financial wellbeing.

- AND the Social Justice subcommittee of Missions is planning to present quarterly speakers on Sunday afternoons on issues of race in our culture with the first one on June 18th to correspond with the Juneteenth celebration the next day.
- AND for the first time since the pandemic, our Scout Troop held their overnight on the church lawn and will participate in Scout Sunday the weekend of June 10th. And the Trustees and Church Council have worked hard to get the parsonage ready to rent and decided to use the turnover to live into our vision of a inclusive community by partnering with the local Immigration Office in settling a large family from the Democratic Republic of the Congo.
- And on top of all this, Church Council is leading the process to analyze and determine how best to use our previous daycare space in light of the many missions of our church.

There is no rest for the weary! Each of these <u>new</u> initiatives reflects Christ's resurrected implication that there is new life and hope for the future. After Christ left the tomb, that is when the spread of the gospel occurred. After our celebration of Easter all of these new ideas and programs came to fruition.

Let us not be discouraged, but rather let us lead the way into a brighter future. Let us not rest on our laurels, but look for new opportunities to live into Jesus' vision of a peaceable kingdom. Let us not be content, but claim the gift of Christian restlessness to spread the word about our church and the good it does in our community and world.

Looking forward to what bubbles up.......

Our program year will soon be winding down and there is much to celebrate! When we gather on June 4th for our 9am worship service we will be thanking our volunteers and celebrating the Faith Formation offering to Church World Service. I hope you have marked your calendars and can join us on this celebration Sunday.

May brings time to get out in our gardens, enjoy the flowers and get my hands into the earth, connecting with God and creation. However, it's also the time for me to reconnect with my friends across New England who work with children, youth and families in their churches, as well as making new connections with others during my annual continuing education retreat, N.E.A.U.C.E. (New England Association of United Church Educators). I am so thrilled to be finally back in person this year at Pilgrim Pines Camp in Swanzey, New Hampshire! I give thanks for this retreat and all the effort the planning team gives to put it together. Having been on the team myself in previous years helps me to appreciate it all the more. I continue to connect with others here in Vermont each month during our Community of Practice Circle (V.A.U.C.E.) sharing about our programs, resources, struggles, joys and supporting each other in our ministries as we hold confidentiality. Currently we are still gathering on Zoom due to how spread out we are here in Vermont. Gathering in a larger setting at N.E.A.U.C.E. for worship, keynote speakers, workshops, brainstorming, and fellowship truly feeds my soul, especially in this outdoor ministry setting with opportunities for walks and lakeside views. This year I will be attending as a Faith Innovator, having been asked to present our Nursery Youth Staffing program in a workshop setting. I reached out to my counterpart at Middlebury UCC, Eliana, and asked if she'd present with me since I got the idea for the program from her predecessor who started it a few years back. She graciously accepted. Another thing that makes this retreat a special one.

May also means it's time to start recruitment for our 2023-24 program year. If you love kids, want to know more about the bible and grow along side them, then please reach out and volunteer to help on Sunday morning as a leader or helper in a peer group or as a spiritual friend on communion Sundays. Faith is not taught, faith is caught. Helping others catch the faith also gives you the opportunity to catch more faith yourself. Our own faith life is enriched exponentially when we help others, learn and grow along side them, and be a witness for Jesus. Volunteer as often as your schedule allows; maybe once a month or maybe every Sunday. You decide. Volunteers are partnered together so that we have two at each of our gatherings which fulfills our Safe Conduct Guidelines. Training will take place in the fall and you'll receive a weekly email keeping you connected to others and supported on your journey. As many of you may know, Pastor Josh served as President of VIA during his final year at FCCEJ. Following his departure, the Missions Committee is stepping up its support of VIA and its mission

("to create solutions to systemic issues that prevent our most vulnerable citizens from enjoying the quality of life God intends for us all." www.viavt.org). We will be inviting the wider FCCEJ community to consider getting involved with one or more of the VIA's five areas of action:

- 1) Racism in Policing
- 2) Economic Injustice
- 3) Affordable Housing
- 4) Prison Reform
- 5) Immigration Reform

Working groups in each of these areas meet monthly (in person and/or on Zoom), and include people from congregations around Vermont, of varying faith backgrounds. Social Justice Group

Are you passionate about social justice? Concerned about racial equity, LGBTQ rights, affordable housing, homelessness, the environment? Curious about any of these issues or others? Wondering how to live out Christ's example to love others? We'd love to hear your voice!

For several years, small groups have been meeting at FCCEJ to discuss racial justice and our Open and Affirming mission. We are looking to join together as one Social Justice group, which will function under the umbrella of the Missions Committee. Our vision is that we will meet as a larger group, and then break out into smaller areas of focus based on participants' interests. Our goals will include both education/learning and action to make a difference in our community.

For example, the Racial Justice Group is planning to invite speakers to FCCEJ and hold a racial justice vigil on Sunday, June 18th, in celebration and recognition of Juneteenth. We'll also be partnering with Vermont Interfaith Action (VIA) on May 10th, to recognize 104 Vermont municipalities who have signed onto a Declaration of Inclusion, welcoming all to their communities. Our first Social Justice Group meeting will be Sunday May 7th, at 11:30 (following second service) in the Marvin Lounge. We'll do some brainstorming and planning for upcoming months. Please join us!

Intergenerational Service Trips

The Jamaica Leadership team is excited to announce that, after a COVID hiatus, we are expanding and re-envisioning our FCCEJ intergenerational service trips! Our hope is to have a service trip every year beginning in 2024, alternating each year between a national and international project. For 2024, we have chosen a service trip within the United States, working with an organization called Global Volunteers. GV coordinates and provides service opportunities all over the US and internationally. In the summer of 2025, our goal is to do an international trip, hopefully returning to work with our partners in Jamaica.

An informational meeting for the 2024 trip is scheduled on Wednesday May 10th at 7pm for those who are interested or curious. Here is some tentative information:

- June 22-29, 2024
- Blackfeet Reservation, Montana
- Ages 12+ (youth 12-15 must be accompanied by an adult)
- Estimated Cost Per Person: \$800 includes all food, lodging and air/ground transportation
- Deposit: \$350 (non-refundable) due date To Be Announced
- Trip Description for full details visit www.globalvolunteers.org/usa-montana/.

We will travel to the Blackfeet Reservation in Montana for a week of cultural immersion and service. Participants might help renovate a classroom or repair a fence, paint an elder's home, help with a summer day-camp program for children, volunteer at the elder care center or help at the food shelf or thrift store.

Ample time is provided after each workday to enjoy local natural and cultural activities on and around the Blackfeet Indian Reservation – which include museum visits, hiking local trails, horseback riding, golfing, fishing, souvenir shopping and participating in community events and celebrations. Volunteers often attend traditional Indian "sweats," sun dances, pow-wows and rodeos. As a Global Volunteer on the Indian Reservation, you have the unique opportunity to experience daily life as a "non-tourist" and participate in daily activities with local residents. We will also have a guided driving tour through Glacier National Park on the first Sunday of our visit.

We're very excited to start these new adventures and look forward to putting a team together! We are always looking for more people to help with planning and fundraising efforts, so please let one of us know if you are interested:

Did you know that our church, the First Congregational Church of Essex Junction, is part of a larger organization in Vermont? We belong to the Champlain Association, one of eight associations within the Vermont Conference of the United Church of Christ. The Vermont Conference's mission is to equip churches for Christ's mission and ministry now and in the future.

Every year, FCCEJ contributes to this wider church. This is called a per capita donation (or dues). We give as part of our connection to the Champlain Association and the Vermont Conference United Church of Christ. Per capita dues cover clergy gatherings and educational support, pastoral search and call, faith formation resources, outdoor ministry camp for youth, training, and resources for staff, and much more.

Per capita dues are assessed on a per member basis according to the membership numbers reported by churches to the Conference as of December 31 of each year. This year our per capita dues are \$14.65 per individual member. We will be asking for this donation on Mother's Day, May 14th. Please give now and if possible double your offering to cover the dues for members who can't give at this time. Of course, donations are always welcome any time of the year.
