Your Pastor's Ponderings......

It might sound strange, but the penitential season of Lent is my favorite. Oh, I love the pomp and triumphalism of Easter and the joyous hope of Christ's birth found in the Christmas season, but there is something raw and real about Lent that I find cathartic and true to life. I appreciate a God that comes to earth and suffers with us instead of causing us to suffer and watching from afar. It is empowering to know that Jesus struggled with temptation and doubt, that he was treated with contempt, despised, and suffered untold indignities like everyone else that has ever lived. And who hasn't struggled with how to come back and how to re-enter life after the betrayal of those closest to you? Who hasn't had to worry about money, or struggled with the faulty perceptions of family and friends about who we are as people, or wondered about the importance of money, or our relationship to the state, or where God's presence is in the midst of despair?

These are issues and situations that we all have to struggle with in life and Jesus did so and Lent calls us to reflect on these things and challenges us to choose the ways of life and wholeness.

There are lots of ways to enter into this Lenten journey. One of the traditional ways is to forego some of the habits and tendencies that draw us away from health and wholeness. So we give up chocolate and cut back on our sugar intake, we cease drinking alcohol and using illegal drugs that often lead us ever so subtly to paths of darkness, dysfunction and destruction. Some give up eating meat or eating out in restaurants. I have found this to be helpful at times and have incorporated this sacrificial behavior into my Lenten journey. All of your lives are different than mine, so fine tuning what you sacrifice giving up for Lent is totally individual.

Wanting to be more positive and less focused on the negative aspects of our lives, some have found it helpful to take on new behaviors and ways of thinking instead of giving things up. My mom used to read the four gospels every Lent. Others write letters to friends or make peace with those in their lives where there is a wedge or issue that stands in the way of an honest and mature relationship. Still others will choose to eat more vegetables or spend time listening to music or sleeping more hours each day or going for a walk and exercising. Some focus on spiritual things by meditating or praying more or just sitting in silence listening for God's guidance or even standing up as an advocate for folks who are homeless, hungry or hounded by the powers that be or even [GASP] going to church ALL 6 Sundays during Lent.

Looking for the presence of the Divine in the midst of the raw and gritty world in which we live is what Lent is all about. Jesus taught us that those are the places in which you would find God: feeding the poor, visiting those imprisoned, welcoming those who have been excluded, challenging the misuse of power by those in authority, or simply sitting with folks struggling to make ends meet. There are a thousand ways in which to live into this Lenten challenge and I will leave it all up to you in your daily lives to figure out how you will deepen your own relationship to the mysterious and powerful presence of God. Our worship services and readings will draw us into these areas. Looking forward to walking this year with you on Christ's Lenten adventure, I am

Laurie's Lens

Lent begins on a beautiful day of love this year, February 14. This gives the word love a richer, fuller meaning. Love from our God. Love of family. Love from Jesus. Love to your neighbor and love of self.

Are you planning on changing anything in your life during Lent this year? Are you accepting the challenge of giving something up, or maybe taking something on? We remember Jesus' life, his ministry, his sacrifices and what it means today for us in our lives and in the world. Forty typically indicates a time of testing, trial, penance, purification, and renewal. Forty days was the length of time Jesus was in the desert, or wilderness, connecting with God and preparing for his ministry. Do you take time to be with God and help prepare yourself for what is to come in your life? Are you finding ways to deepen your faith and walk the path of your faith journey? It will most likely be challenging, rewarding, peaceful, insightful, lonely, quiet, and Spirit filled. Our journey can also be a time of forgiveness, calming, and restfulness. Have you ever wondered what it must be like to live in someone else's shoes? Maybe this Lent you decide to take something away that you normally take for granted but that maybe someone you know cannot do. Maybe you give up this luxury item and stop eating it or using this one thing that you know this other person cannot do, have or eat. Maybe you have decided to take on a task that you know would help yourself and/or others as you move forward on your journey and they on theirs. Give it some thought. I'm still thinking about what mine will be. I hope you will share what you decide to do.

Lent is also time when we can be more intentional about our daily devotional life and prayer time with God. If you are one who would prefer to have a daily devotion in your email inbox, you can subscribe to the UCC's daily devotions at https://www.ucc.org/daily-devotional/. I'm sure you can find a quiet place in your house to sit. Maybe you have that soft comfy chair that everyone in your house knows is your place to sit. Maybe your time to connect with God is with your morning tea/coffee. I would like to encourage you to place your bible close by or use https://www.biblegateway.com/ if you want to look up more scripture, read a devotional each day of Lent and set aside ten minutes of your day to sit and connect with your God.

For those of you who like a little history lesson ... Lent is a 40 day journey, not counting Sundays, until we arrive at Easter. According to the Bible, Jesus' death and resurrection occurred around the time of the Jewish Passover, which was celebrated on the first full moon following the vernal equinox. For Christians, today, Easter Sunday falls on the first Sunday following the first full moon after the vernal equinox (or the first day of spring). If the first full moon occurs on the equinox, Easter is the following Sunday. So ... Easter Sunday can fall anywhere between March 22 and April 25th. Once you know when Easter Sunday is...you count back 40 days, not including Sundays, and you will arrive on Ash Wednesday. Easter falls on March 31st this year and so counting back 40 days, except Sundays, we end up on Ash Wednesday, February 14th.

Please remember to mark your calendars for Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper, Ash Wednesday service and Pretzel Sunday on March 17th.


