Easter Weekend Prayer Vigil

The ancient <u>Prayer Vigil</u> answers Jesus' call to pray, from the moment of Christ's death at 3pm Friday afternoon, to the moment of his resurrection at 7am Easter morning: 40 hours. Individuals, couples, or families are encouraged to sign up for one hour. You will have the Sanctuary to yourself to pray, or read scripture, or sing hymns, or simply to sit in silence and soak in God's presence. Once your hour is complete, people are asked to let the next person in so they can have the same experience.
