

On Friday, April 19 and Saturday, April 20, FCCEJ hosted the Vermont Conference Annual Meeting. By Monday morning, two local pastors had emailed me to share how impressed they were with our faith community. Two busy people took the time to lift up and acknowledge a job well done. As your pastor, I was never so proud in your efforts, your ability to be flexible, stay on target, and get the job done well!

The Trustees made sure that the West Wing was painted and ready for use. They also stayed on the ball to ensure that our elevator was in good working order; they even came in to turn on the hot water!

Doug Olufsen was the tech superstar who drew disparate information together into a unified whole and was the cornerstone in ensuring that both the delegates in the sanctuary as well as those participants at home could be present and see the resources needed to vote and understand what was going on at the meeting.

Three of our musical groups [Sanctuary Choir, Men at First, and Finally @ First] all put in extra time the week after Easter to have a wide variety of quality music to support the closing worship service. Many a pastor came up to me a bit jealous at all the options we have for great music at FCCEJ. Special thanks to Bethany, Bill, and Rick for corralling their members to perform.

The three meal teams that oversaw the set-up, serving, and clean-up of every meal were seamless. One restaurant came in with a team and just needed a little support, while the other restaurant just dropped off their food and we had to figure everything out and get it ready quickly. The morning meal was organizing all the food that our folks brought in and serving to what was expected to be a crowd of 30-40 people: 75 showed up! All I observed through all of this work was grace under fire, laughter, camaraderie, dedicated work and a spirit of community that warmed my heart.

The ushers stationed around the building and floating to help people find their way were also astoundingly good. With grace abounding, they were cheerful, helpful, and able to step up and adapt their task to meet needs as they arose. Again, I observed our folks having fun as they were working hard.

We also had a team that prepared the snack tables between meals and so had to take the snacks out of Fellowship Hall before each meal and then re-set them back into Fellowship Hall afterwards so delegates and visitors could snack throughout the day. Again, no complaints, just upbeat devotion to the task and friendliness toward those partaking of the snacks.

We had our youth working in the nursery, offering a safe, comfortable space for children.

Our official delegates came and represented our church at the official meetings of the conference.

Jen, Laurie, Elizabeth, Bethany, and Kul all helped to make this happen with Jen working with the conference staff the closest to ensure that all the disparate parts came together in the correct order and way.

Carl Wermer helped where he could, first in the nursery, and then the parking lot, and everywhere in between. Several followed his lead and told me to put them to work doing anything that was needed. What was even better, since I was not always to be found, was how many folks saw a problem, figured out how to fix it, and then moved on. So many of you came for the day and simply jumped in to serve. We have the best volunteers of any church I have ever served, and I was grateful and proud of how everyone came together to make it work.

Seeing all of your efforts through the conference weekend reminded me of Paul's letter to the Corinthians when he talks about the church using the body imagery and how every member of the body of Christ has gifts given to them by the Spirit for the upbuilding of the church and how together, everyone makes up the body of Christ. All of you did so with grace and love.

Stewardship is Everything!

Dear Friends,

Did you know that our church, the First Congregational Church of Essex Junction, is part of a larger organization in Vermont? We belong to the Champlain Association, one of eight associations within the Vermont Conference of the United Church of Christ. The Vermont Conference's mission is to equip churches for Christ's mission and ministry now and in the future.

Every year our church contributes to this wider church. This is called a Per Capita donation (or dues). We give as part of our connection to the Champlain Association and the Vermont Conference United Church of Christ. Per Capita dues cover clergy gatherings and educational support, pastoral search and call, faith formation resources, outdoor ministry camp for youth, training and resources for staff, and much more.

Per Capita dues are assessed on a per member basis according to the membership numbers reported by churches to the Conference as of December 31 of each year. This year our per capita dues are \$15.33 per individual member. We will be asking for this donation on Mother's Day, May 12th. Please give now and if possible double your offering to cover the dues for members who can't give at this time. Of course, any donation later in the year is also welcome. The giving tab on our website (www.fccej.org) makes it easy to share your monetary gift with the church.

Montana Service Trip

The mission of FCCEJ Service Trips is to foster understanding of our national and global community through intergenerational volunteer work. These trips provide opportunities for youth and adults to participate at a domestic or international site to work on projects identified by the host community.

In June, an intergenerational team of seventeen FCCEJ members will be heading to the Blackfeet Nation in Montana to work on service projects identified by the Blackfeet people. In preparation for this immersive experience, the team has been meeting monthly to learn about the culture and to engage in activities designed to build team cohesion. We are partnering with Global Volunteers, our liaison with the Blackfeet Nation, who is making arrangements for our local transportation, lodging and meals.

During the week we are on the reservation, each team member will be paired with a person from the Blackfeet community, with whom they will work collaboratively at the assigned project site. Options might be helping at the food pantry, assisting with the summer camp for kids, or working on a labor project. Other options might be planting trees or helping at the senior citizen’s center. We are excited to work with a person from the Blackfeet Nation on a project, giving us the chance to learn from each other.

We are grateful for this chance to serve and are most appreciative of the support from the FCCEJ community.

Grief Support Group


2nd Thursday of each month ~ 10-11:30am in Marvin Lounge.
