The Practice of Lectio Davina [A Hands on Biblical Practice]

Introduction

One Scripture engagement technique that has a long and rich history is lectio divina, Latin for "sacred reading," it has been in use for over a thousand years and was originally practiced by monks who noticed that at times individual words, phrases, or verses seemed to leap off the page with a special personal importance. These special words or verses can give a sense of encouragement, comfort, thankfulness, or conviction that often applies to present situations and can draw us closer to God. The four traditional stages of lectio divina are lectio (reading), meditatio (meditation), oratio (prayer), and contemplatio (contemplation).

Reading the Scripture

Psalm 30

A psalm. A song. For the dedication of the temple of David.

**I will exalt you, O God, for you have lifted me up,
and did not let my enemies rejoice over me.**

O God, my God, I cried to you for help, and you healed me.

**You brought me up from the realm of the dead, O God;
you restored my life as I was sinking into the grave.**

**Sing praises to God, all you faithful; give thanks to God's holy name.
For God's anger lasts but a moment, but God's favor lasts a lifetime;
weeping may stay for the night, but joy comes in the morning.**

As for me, I said in my security, "I shall never be shaken."
By your favor, O God, you had established me as a strong mountain;
but when you hid your face, I was dismayed.
To you, O God, I cried, and to you I made my appeal:
"What gain is there in my destruction, in my going down to the pit?
Will the dust praise you? Will it tell of your faithfulness?
Hear me, O God, and be gracious to me! O God, be my helper!"
You have turned my mourning into dancing;
you have taken off my sackcloth and clothed me with joy,
so that my soul may praise you and not be silent.
O God, my God, I will give thanks to you forever.

Jonah will read the passage aloud a total of three times. Each time, we will attend to a different aspect of the text

The First Reading: Find a word, phrase, image, or metaphor that is especially meaningful to you. After the reading, we will sit in silence for two minutes. Focus intently on why the Holy Spirit might have chosen these words to speak to you today. Reflect on how it might apply to your life. Is it relevant to something that you are going through? Does it bring to mind a struggle that you have been dealing with? Do certain people come to mind that God may want you to reach out to or reconcile a relationship with? Is there a strong sense of movement or change that needs to happen? When you are thinking about a passage in God's presence, ask the Holy Spirit to illuminate that passage so that you can grasp the message in terms of your own life.

Then you are invited to share it aloud: a simple statement of one or a few words with **No elaboration!**

The Second Reading: Listen anew to the scripture passage and see what draws you into the text this time. We will sit in silence again for 1-2 minutes. During this time, go deeper and reflect on what they see or hear is going on in their phrase or text and think about why did this text come to the fore? Look for meaning and insight concerning what God wants for your life or the life of our church. Anyone is free to briefly share in one or two sentences, what additional meaning you have drawn from your word, phrase or text.

Then one **last reading** of Scripture and time of Reflective Silence
