Josh's House combines local and national resources, emergency services, and research to provide veterans the resiliency, transition and reintegration tools to help them sustain or return to full and healthy lives. Many veterans being served at the Pallotta House are recovering from tobacco, alcohol, and drug addiction. These veterans rely on sugar to get them through their addiction.
