A Litany of Remembrance

At the end of the litany, everyone is invited to come forward to light a candle of remembrance for someone they have loved or for a circumstance that makes this season difficult. Light the candle saying their name or situation out loud if you would like and then return to your seat.

<u>Leader</u>: We light this first candle to remember those whom we have loved and lost. We pause to remember their names, their faces, their voices, the memories that bind them to us in this season.

<u>Leader</u>: We light this second candle to remember the pain of loss of relationships, the loss of jobs, the loss of health. We pause to gather up the pain of the past and offer it to God, asking God for the gift of peace.

<u>Leader</u>: We light this third candle to remember our faith and the gift of hope that the Christmas story offers. We remember Jesus came to personally know human life, to teach us how to find positive meaning out of the pain and promises us a place and time of no more suffering.

<u>People</u>: Let us remember Jesus our friend, who shows us the way, who brings us truth, and who bears the light.
